

Wills - September Court 1833.

In the name of God, Amen.

I Thomas Capel of the County of Rutherford and State of North Carolina, being aged & infirm but of sound mind and memory, called to mind the mortality of the body, and remembering that it is appointed unto all men once to die, do make & ordain this my last will and testament. And first I commend my soul to almighty God who gave it, and my body to the earth, to be buried in a decent Christian manner, at the discretion of my executors.

As touching such worldly substance as I am blessed with, I allow all my just and lawful debts and burial expenses to be discharged out of it.

Secondly, I hereby give and bequeath unto my friends and near kinsman Daniel Wilson the whole of my estate both personal & real, & every other thing or things of which I may die possessed; and the said Daniel Wilson shall at my death have & hold a full right & title to all my land and premises according to the ends now in my possession, and all my other estate by virtue of this my last will and testament.

Lastly, I do hereby nominate, constitute and appoint my said friend Daniel Wilson and Henry M. Kerr the executors of this my last will and testament. In witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and affixed my seal this fourth day of December in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and twenty six.
