& declare this my last will and testament in the following
manner & form. First I give and bequeath to Martha my
beloved wife the use of my estate both real and personal
during her natural life & after her decease to be divided
in the following manner and under such restrictions as is
herein after mentioned that is to say.

First the hundred & fifty acres of land to my two youngest
son, Ernest & Samuel to be laid off to them begining on the
west bank of the double branches running east with the old
line to east bank of Little River more than North for compliment
so as to include plantation view grounds of both water
courses.

Secondly the residue of my lands to be equally divided
by a north and south line and the part lying on the east
side, I give and bequeath to my son Paul & daughter Nancy
and the part lying on the West side to my son Mundy
and daughter Elizabeth. This is my will and desire and
it is to be understood, the land remain & disposed of in
this second Article in so far as values and then to whom
it is bequeathed namely Paul & Nancy, Mundy and
Elizabeth is to pay to my son Elijah and daughters
Martha, Dorcas May and Nancy a sum proportioned
to make them equal in the division of my land. And
also it is my desire that my personal Estate be equally divided
amongst my Children namely Paul, Elijah, Mundy, Ernest
Black Wm, Martha Dorcas Elizabeth, May, Frances & Nancy
Shan and Shan alike.

And lastly I constitute Martha and Ernest my
true friends William Blackburn & my beloved son Ernest
executors of this my last will and testament.

Item 4. I will and desire that my executors pay to Lawrence
Padus two hundred dollars when all the money is accounted
for my land as above.

Item 5. My will and desire is that my wife Sarah Estes
remove to the State of Virginia & there make a purchase of
one hundred acres of first rate land, by the advice and counsel of
her friends and the same to be paid for out of my estate
and to enjoy and possess the same during her life in a widowhood.

Item 6. I will and desire to my wife Sarah Estes by her
equal part with one of my children out of all my estate to have
and to have forever.

Item 7. I also will and desire that my wife Sarah Estes
sell all my black people and hunting dogs together with all
the rest of my personal property after my just debts are paid and
such property as is considered by my executors, best to be sold during
her natural life or widowhood with the following exceptions
that whenever any of my children arrives to the age of twenty
one years a intermarrying he shall have my wills that
each child so marrying receive their full share and an

4 to be Valued by them or who may be educated by this
portion or my executors.

That 8th day will and desire is that my estate be equally
divided amongst my Children & wife as above share and
there alike all but my son Washington and him
I desire the share that is as much more as either of
my other legatees for the purpose of giving him a
liberal Education which I wish him to have —

Also 9th day I do hereby constitute my two Brothers
John Eddy & George Greenings Executors of this my last
will and testament &c.

And I do hereby constitute, make and ordain
and appoint my beloved wife Maria Elizabeth Shibley
& my Trusty Friend John Randal the sole executors of
of this my last Will and testament And I do
hereby wholly disallow make and disannul all &
