The execution of the last Will & Testament
of Andrew Jackson of which the first
is a true copy was proven in open
court by the oath of William Frazer
Clerk to be recorded which is worded
as follows

Wm. Frazer
Clerk

In the name of God Amen! I John Bailey
of the County of Wicks & State of N Carolina
being weak in body but of sound and perfect
mind and memory think proper to make
and ordain my last Will & Testament in manner
following that is, first I give and bequeath
my soul unto the hands of Almighty God. & my body
to the earth to be buried
in a Christian like manner

And as touching my worldly estate & effects
whereunto it has pleased God to bless me with
in this life I give and bequeath the same as
following first it is my Will that my Just Debts
shall be paid as well as the funeral expenses
and my outstanding Debts which are due on shall
be settled by my executor hereafter named —
2^dly Whereas I am possessed of three Black
Children one girl by the name of Citty also
one girl by the name of Polly and one
Boy named Richard, the first 8 years old
the 2^d 3 years old by male parent and the
last 6 months old —

I will that the girls shall be free at the age of
of Eighteen and the boy at the age of twenty one and
the Mother of said Children I will that she
shall live with her 3 children aforesaid if she
survive until they come to be of age —
