Just one his feet, gaiters, two shoes all the farming utensils one loom one iron pot & hooks one small frying pan two coffee cans two feather beds two counterpane blue check, one white sheet or counterpane square by wearing, one loom, chair of the saws spurs all the earthen ware about my house, one looking glass one pewter plate two pillows one walnut bedstead all the grain on hand and the crop growing.
Item Second I will & bequeath to my Daughter Maria all my wearing apparel & the remainder of my bed clothing - Item third I will to my son Joseph in addition to the above one shot gun one flat Iron I further will all the cloth on hand to Joseph & the Bible & all his school books I further will all the remainder of my property to my son & Daughter to be equally divided between as they think best they may each choose persons if they cannot agree to act for them in the division or make sale of the property & divide the money each of them to pay equal of the funeral expenses I do ordain the above to be my last will & testament this the twenty first day of March 1843.
