In the name of God Amen, I Anna Margaretha Kriger of Salem, Stokes County & State of North Carolina being weak in body, but of sound mind & memory do this fifteenth day of July A.D. one thousand eight & thirty four, make and publish this my last will and Testament in manner & form following that is to say,

- 1) I will that all my just debts and my funeral Expences be duly paid by my hereafter named executor
- 2) I give & bequeath unto Daniel Meller of Frederick County State of Maryland the sum of one hundred dollars & to Elizabeth Rudy wife of Christian Rudy also the sum of one hundred dollars.
- 3) I give & bequeath unto John Christman Reckler of Salem the sum of Fifty dollars also to John Jacob Blum the sum of Fifty dollars.
- 4) I further give & bequeath unto Friederica Reckler as Governor of the single sister's Chair in Salem & to her successor or successors in office in trust for the sum of One hundred dollars, to the sole & only use of the Salem single sister's poor fund.
- 5) I give & bequeath unto Hannah Spach of Salem and to Anna Rothkeas of Salem & to Elizabeth Blum wife of John P. Blum now in Indiana to each and every one the sum of Thirty dollars.
- 6) I give & bequeath unto Lestina Stoeckburger the sum of Fifty dollars & further Ten dollars more in addition.
- 7) I further give and bequeath unto John Kriger, Jacob Kriger Samuel Kriger Daniel Kriger Levi Joseph Kriger Henry Kriger & William Kriger all of Maryland & to Henry Reichecker my nephew & to Jacob Rudy & Maria Mische daughter of Chr. Rudy & to Barbara Wilcutt to each and every one the sum of Twenty five dollars
- 8) I further give & bequeath unto Antanette Smith daughter of John Smith of Maryland, and to each of my godchildren viz. to Annette Moore wife of St. Moore of Maryland to Olive Homer, Lisetta Manning Matilda Severn Annette Reich & Rebecca Shultz to each the sum of Twenty five dollars and to my friend Barbara Leinbach & Rebecca Hartman to each the sum of Twenty five Dollars.

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9. I give & bequeath unto my several friends to Mary White, Friedrice Riedel, Barbara Folly widow, Charles Rimmer, Polly Materson & Dorothy Blum wife of Jacob to each and every one the sum of Twenty Dollars.
 - 10) I give & bequeath unto Friederica Reckler the sum of Ten Dollars, and to Hansh Elis Shultz the sum of Five Dollars.
 - 11) I give & bequeath unto Elisabeth Stoeckburger my green silk gown, unto Matilda Severn my chest of drawers, to Sophia Maria Blum my desk & book case, to Maria Van Blum my large beaquist brown with frock & my black & my black silk Mantel, & further I give to a friendina Elisabeth Stoeckburger the sum of Twenty Dollars.
 - 12) My sixth, large looking glass I give to Elisabeth Minkler and to Henry Minkler & William Minkler to each I give three of my Windsor chairs.
 - 13) I will & bequeath unto Constantine Herbet my silver watch.
 - 14) It is my will that all my remaining wearing apparel, cloths, Linens, cottons, woollens, & whatever not herein otherwise bequeathed & all the remainder of my loose property, shall be divided by my hereafter named Executor with the assistance & advice of the Governor of the single sister's house in Salem amongst the several single sisters in the town of Salem, as near to a list by me handed to them, and agreeable to their best judgment.
 - 15) It is further my will that if any of my monies, or notes & bonds, after all before mentioned legacies are paid & my funeral expences & burial agreeable to use & custom in the church whereof I am a member and all other expences by my Executor incurred be paid, then such balance of my estate shall be & I hereby give it unto my nephew Daniel Meller Junior.
 - 16) I do hereby make & appoint my friend John Jacob Blum of Salem my executor of this my last will & Testament to be the same executed to & according to this my intent and meaning.

Also in article eight, the legacy of twenty five dollars to Rebecca Hartman is void and in her place I bequeath to Elizabeth Herbel widow of Henry R Herbel the sum of twenty five dollars. Also in article nine legacy to Mary White is void & annulled. In article ten I make void the legacy of ^{the} dollars to Frederica Becker.
