Doubt widow in the County of Stokes & State of North Carolina being in sound & perfect mind & memory (Helped by God) do this 25th day of January in the year of our Lord 1826 make & publish this my last will & testament in manner and form following after recommending my soul to God who gave it & my body to its mother earth to be buried in decent & Christian order by my Executors hereinafter mentioned.

1st. I will that all my personal estate be sold among my children or in any way they see proper, except my wearing apparel which I give to my beloved two daughters M. Elizabeth & E. Mary Doubt
2ndly, I will that after my debts are collected, that the debts & lawful expenses be paid, after which I will that my estate remaining be equally divided among my beloved six sons & two daughters, namely according to age Henry Doubt, William Doubt, Jacob Doubt, Joseph Doubt, Elizabeth Doubt, Michael Doubt, Mary Doubt & Peter Doubt, and also that Alvira Doubt & John W. C. Doubt (affairs of John Doubt and have one part of my estate with all my above named children, that is to say, they two have as much as one of the other above named.

And I hereby make & ordain my beloved two sons Henry Doubt & Michael Doubt Executors of this my last will & testament, in case of the death of either of them, or both, that any of the others of my beloved children act. In witness I the said Mary E. Doubt witness to this my last will & testament set my hand & seal the year & date above written.

I now all men by these presents that I Benjamin Clements of the
County of Stokes & State of North Carolina being now in my perfect mind
& senses do make & ratify this to be my last will & testament.

In the name of God amen, I doth will that all my just debts shall
be paid out of my estate.

2nd That to my two dearest daughters Susan Cole & Litty Tucker
I have given four negroes each, which the heirs have now got in
possession, also two beds & furniture.

3rd I give unto my youngest infant daughter Nancy Bon
four negroes, one named Lewis, one named Larkin, one named Dennis
& one named Louisa, also one bed & furniture, also one thousand dollars in
money, which is now in the hand of Abdon Scales Esq. Now if the said
Nancy Bon does not live to an age sufficient to receive the
above Legacy, I will that it shall return to the heirs of Susan Cole
& Litty Tucker, to be divided among them equally, each heir to receive
an equal portion with another.

4th, I do will that my lands on the waters of Burck Stone creek &
Dan river at my death shall be divided between the heirs of Susan
Cole & Litty Tucker. Now in the division of these lands I do will that
Litty Tucker's two children shall receive as much as Susan Cole's eight.

5th, I do will that my wife shall have the use of the tract of Land
that I now live on during her life of widowhood, also I bind unto
her so much of my live stock, house hold & kitchen furniture,
farming utensils &c as she may think proper to retain for the use of
carrying on the farm to support her. The balance if any to be
sold & applied to the payment of my debts, as divided among the
heirs above named. I also bind unto her two negroes, a man named
Buck, a woman named Charlotte during her life of widowhood and
then at her death or marriage to be sold & divided among the heirs
of Susan Cole & Litty Tucker in the same manner as the lands above
named, the tract of Land that I now live on at the death or marriage
& my wife to be divided in halves, and divided among the heirs
Susan Cole & Litty Tucker in the same manner as the land a-

Burch stone creek & Dan river. The two youngest negroes that I leave to my daughter Mary John being too small to live out, I will that my wife take them, say Spencer & Louisa, & keep them until they are large enough to live out & that she shall be paid a reasonable allowance for their support. The stock on hand with the Land at the death or marriage of my wife to be sold & divided with the Land in the same manner.

I do hereby nominate constitute & appoint William C. Cole & John Griffin my Executors to this my last will & Testament. In witness whereof I set my hand & seal this sixth day of March in the year of our Lord one thousand, eight hundred & thirty five

In the name of God Amen, I Edmund Tilly Senior of the County of Stokes being mindful of my mortality but believing in a resurrection to eternal life do this seventh day of October in the year of our Lord eighteen hundred & forty nine make an publish this my last will & testament in manner following

- 1 First, I bequeath my body after my decease to its native earth to be decently interred —
- 2 Secondly, I give & bequeath unto my son David Tilly my negro boy Martin to him & his heirs forever —
- 3 Thirdly, I give & bequeath unto my son David Tilly my negro girl Malinda & her increase by paying Two hundred & fifty Dollars in three years after my decease
- 4 Fourth, I will that my negro woman Becky & my negro boy Jim be sold after my decease & the money equally divided among my children
- 5 Fifth, I will that all of my land to be sold & the money equally divided among my children

6 Sixth, I will that all of my Household property be sold & equally divided among all my children
And I do hereby constitute & appoint David Tilly & Matthew R. Moore Executors of this my last will & Testament. In witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand & seal the day & year first above written
