

This is my last will & testament. that what little property I have, may be divided peaceably. My small table, my two sheet iron plates for baking, my cake pan & fire tongs I bequeath to my daughter Maria Magdalene, & my iron skillet to Betty Shantz. My bedding viz; a straw bed, feather bed, feather covering bed & two covers for the same and two bed sheets I bequeath to Lina. My habits or gown given to me by my brother Frederic & hatched to it I bequeath to Betty Shantz. My blue apron party silk to Lina. My green shawl to Susana, my white shawl to Jerome, my blue silk handkerchief as a keepsake to Catherine Guitain (2). The French crown to my ~~beloved~~ god-daughter Henrietta. My silver threads (or scales) to Christopher. My bellows & bible to Samuel Shantz, & the remainder of my clothing to my daughter Lina. To my God daughter Henrietta I bequeath my red chintz & to the same also my gray silk shawl given to me by Mr Peter. My red chintz & bed quilt I bequeath to Lina Shantz, & to the same also all the remainder of my clothing. My axe & lion wedge I bequeath to Lina, & all the other household furniture to my son Jacob. My house & lot I bequeath to my daughter Maria Magdalene.

I now all men by these presents that I leave to my wife Mary Reischel the sum of one thousand dollars for her use of the interest thereon during her life time, when the will shall be my seven children, or their heirs in equal shares —

I furthermore bequeath to my children Clara Cornelia, Edward Henry, Sophia, Henrietta, William Cornelia, Angelia, Wilhelmine, Amelia Charlotte, & Ernestine Sophie each three hundred dollars or equal shares for all my proper in Bank & on interest.

I leave all my books & property to be divided equally among the members of my family here according to the option of my wife Mary Reischel, she retaining for her own use whatever she likes.

My forte piano is to be kept for the use of the younger children

I appoint as my executors my good friend Rev. Thos. Hunter and Rev. J. A. Steiner to sign my hand & seal this my

I also beg the directors of the Mearnsian society in Salem and Bethlehem to provide for my widow & to care for the education of my children so that my son Edward Henry & William Cornelia be sent to the Mearns Boarding school to qualify for the ministry in our church

My dear wife is appointed by me guardian for all our children & has the sole direction of her five daughters
