this my last Will & Testament in manner & form following

1st I will that all my just debts be paid & all my dues collected

2nd I will that after my burial expenses are paid & all my debts against
that my estate be distributed as follows -

3 I give & bequeath unto my son John Philip Reich the sum of fifty dollars

4 I give unto my daughter Catharine Clewell the sum of one hundred
dollars & my Forts Plans which is the possession of my said daughter

5 I will that all my clothing & shall be equally divided among my
three daughters Catharine Louisa & Henrietta,

6 I will that my Jacob shall have the refusal of my house
and lot in Salem paying for it Eleven hundred dollars but if
he should not be inclined to take said house and lot at
the price mentioned my Executors shall sell the said property to
the best advantage they can under the lease I hold -

7 All the household furniture including an iron stove shall
be sold by my executor either at public or private sale
or they may think fit but it is expressly to be understood that
the beds of my children Louisa Edward & Henrietta or all other
who are not of age are not considered as my property but exclu-
sively their own & of my bed I will that my son Edward &
my daughter Louisa & Henrietta shall have them bed & furniture

8 All the proceeds of the sales so made & all other property not
herein named shall be equally divided between all my children
(to wit John Philip, Jacob, Emanuel, Edward Catharine
Louisa & Henrietta share & share alike And I do hereby appoint my
son John Philip & Jacob Reich to be executors of this my last will and
Testament hereby revoking all others by me made prior to the present date

manner, 1st I give & bequeath unto Elizabeth Bingham twenty dollars

one large bed pillow & my new bed cover let four yards ginghams my
green calico gown & my black Muslin cloak 2. To Charity Snider
Twenty dollars further my Beavers two bed sheets, two towels & my new
white gown, 3 To Christine Snider I give & bequeath ten dollars -

4 To Frederica Reich I give & bequeath ten dollars

5 To Johanna Snider I give five dollars & a grey calico gown

6 To Dorothea Warner I give & bequeath fifteen dollars & my new
& my new feather bed & two cotton bed sheets -

7 To the fund for the support of the Missions of the United Brethren
among the Heathen I give & bequeath twenty dollars

8 To the fund established for the support of the poor sick lying
in the single women's house in Salem I give and bequeath
twenty dollars & likewise, should after the payment of all my just
debts & funeral expenses & all the money I have bequeathed & all
legacies are paid any sum of money be left not bequeathed herein
such sum whatever it may be shall also belong & I bequeath
it to the fund for the same mentioned purpose for the support of

the sick in said women's house. Mary Fickell of Salem & her
My sister of Salem I give two bed sheets & my new quilted
counterpane & a blue shawl To Mary Smith two of my best
shirts & my grey homeman gown & my new morning gown

To Mary Fickell of Salem already before mentioned I give in addition
one morning gown & one white shawl & my flax spinning wheel

To Polly Fickell my black bonnet & bonnet To Elizabeth Snider
my red calico gown & my white gown To Christine Snider I

give my calico morning gown & my brown gown one towel
& one every day wearing handkerchief To Margaretta Snider

my large white shawl - To Rebecca Holder my black gown
& my bundle no handkerchief To Susan Phelps a coarse large
shawl & to Dorothea Warner one silver table spoon -

The little furniture I am possessed of such as cups, silver spoons
plates &c shall all fall to the legacy of Charity Snider in addition to
that bequeathed to her above Every one of the sick who dwell
with me in one room I give & bequeath each of them one
apron & one handkerchief & should any thing of my clothing return
to
