- 3 I give & bequeath unto my son John Philip Rich the sum of fifty dollars
- 4 I give unto my daughter Catherine Clewell the sum of one hundred
dollars & my Horse Piano which is the possession of my said daughter
- 5 I will that all my clothing & shall be equally divided among my
three daughters Catherine Louisa & Henrietta,
- 6 I will that my Jacob shall have the refusal of my house
and lot in Salem paying for it Eleven hundred dollars but if
he should not be inclined to take said house and lot at
the price mentioned my Executors shall sell the said property to
the best advantage they can under the lease I hold -
- 7 All the household furniture including an Iron stove shall
be sold by my executor either at public or private sale
or they may think fit but it is expressly to be understood that
the beds of my children Louisa Edward & Henrietta or all three
who are not of age are not considered as my property but exclu-
sively their part of my bed I will that my son Edward &
my daughter Louisa & Henrietta shall have them beds respectively
- 8 All the proceeds of the sales so made & all other property not
herein named shall be equally divided between all my children
to wit John Philip, Jacob, Emanuel, Edward Catherine Catherine
Louisa & Henrietta share & share alike And I do hereby appoint my
son John Philip & Jacob Rich to be executor of this my last will and
Testament hereby revoking all other by me made prior to the present date

6 To Dorothea Warner I give & bequeath fifteen dollars & my armoire
& my new feather bed & two cotton bed sheets -
7 To the fund for the support of the Missions of the United Brethren
among the Heathen I give & bequeath twenty dollars
8 To the fund established for the support of the poor sick living
in the single women's house in Salem I give and bequeath
twenty dollars & likewise, should after the payment of all my just
debts & funeral expenses & all the money I have bequeathed & all
debtors are paid any sum of money be left not bequeathed herein
such sum what ever it may be shall also belong & I bequeath
it to the fund for the same mentioned purpose for the support of

counterpane & a blue shawl To Mary Smith two of my best
shirts & my grey homespun gown & my new morning gown
To Mary Fickell of Salem already before mentioned I give in addition
one morning gown & one white shawl & my flax spinning wheel
To Polly Case hold my black bonnet & to Elizabeth Shinn
my red calico gown & my white gown To Sistine Proff I
give my calico morning gown & my brown gown one towel
& one every day wearing handkerchief To Margaretta Briggs
my large white shawl - To Rebecca Holden my black gown
& my bandan no handkerchief To Susan Philps a coarse large
shawl & to Dorothea Warner one silver table spoon -

The little furniture I am possessed of such as cups, silver spoons
plates &c. shall all fall to the legacy of Ellen & Ann in addition to
that bequeathed to her above Every one of the living who dwell
with me in one room I give & bequeath each of them one
apron & one handkerchief & should any thing of my clothing or other
things be left after the division it shall be divided among them

190) the young women who live and labour in the kitchen in our said house. And it is my desire & sincere wish that Miss Dorothea Warner and Miss Morgan the kitchen shall in conjunction with my Executors herein after named make the division of that part of my effects as far as respects my clothing bedding &c. And I do hereby make constitute and appoint my trusty friend Conrad Kreuser Executor of this my last Will & Testament whom I hereby empower to pay all my lawful debts & settle all my accounts - Reversing hereby & annulling all my former wills & Legacies done & made either in writing or by word of mouth and acknowledging this to be my last will & Testament In witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand & seal this twenty seventh day of August one thousand eight hundred & eighty two

In the name of God Amen! I John Gambold Missionary among the Cherokee tribe of Indians being in good health and of sound memory for which I may thank God the giver of all good gifts remembering that it is appointed for man once to die do hereby make known my last Will and Testament concerning those things whereunto to bless me it has pleased the Lord in manner following Viz;

- 1 my just and lawful debts which I may have incurred on my private account and are unpaid at my decease shall be paid out of my estate
- 2 My English Quarto Bible with Copper plates printed by Matthew Carey Philadelphia 1801. I give as a remembrance to my little godson David Zeisberger's Son
- 3 To my dear & beloved wife Anna Maria late widow Shultz formerly Grabs I give & bequeath all those German books which are my own property all that part of household furniture which is mine own my silver watch silver snuff box all other things of silver I may be possessed of - her wearing apparel with all my linen made up or not, all handkerchiefs & shawls all such parts of my beds & bed clothing as she shall choose to retain for her own use & generally all other things in my possession at my decease which are not otherwise disposed of by this my last Will
- 4 To my beloved friend John Penance Smith Missionary at Spring place Cherokee Nation I give for the use and benefit of the Mission of the United Brethren among the Cherokee Indians all my English books my clothing except shirts then being included in No 3. &c. &c. all my edge tools that part of my bedding which my said wife does not choose for her use
- 5 All money or moneys due to me at the time of my decease or well for interest on a bond of Theodore Shultz for Blum hundred dollars dated 31st March 1823 or on any other account shall be paid to my said dear wife Anna Maria
- 6 The interest which shall become due on the said bond after my decease shall be paid to my said wife Anna Maria yearly as long as she lives
- 7 After the decease of my said dear wife Anna Maria the above said principal sum of Blum hundred dollars shall be divided in manner following: To the daughters of my dear wife Anna Maria by former marriage Viz; Gertrude Lucretia Shultz & Dorothea Mettels Shultz shall be paid one hundred dollars to each. To the four children of my brother Joseph Gambold Viz; John Frederick Gambold Sophia Elizabeth now widow Martel Anna Benigna wife of Philip Sypnowski & Maria Reine Gambold shall be paid to each of them several parts
