in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred
and forty three make and published this my last
Will and Testament in manner following: viz
First I commend my soul to God who gave it, and
my body to the earth to be decently buried according
to the Rites of the Church, whose member I am.
Secondly it is my will that all my just debts and
funeral expences be duly paid
Thirdly I give and bequeath unto my mother Elizabeth
Fohl my bureau, trunk, bedstead, my best shirt, black
silk shawl, new shirting and diaper, and the residue
of my money should there be any.
Fourthly I give and bequeath unto my sister Fredericka
Fohl my small chair, a small gold pin and two of

my most glass tumbler,
Fifthly I give and bequeath unto my sister Sophia Fohl
my ~~small~~ table and half a dozen purple cups & saucers,
Sixthly I give and bequeath unto my sister in law Ann
Elizabeth Fohl late Spawder my black and
Seventhly I give and bequeath unto my niece Clementine
Fohl my new calico quilt and my best bonnet,
Eighthly I give and bequeath unto my niece
Fohl my black shawl and parasol,
Ninthly I give and bequeath unto my nephew Lewis
Fohl my umbrella,
Tenthly I give and bequeath unto my nephew Augustus
Fohl English bible,
Eleventhly I give and bequeath unto my nephew Chris-
tian Fohl my english hymn book
Twelfthly I give and bequeath unto my niece Mary
Fohl my small tin trunk a gift of my father and
all my glass toy,
Thirteenthly I give and bequeath unto my sister in law
Anna Shuman Fohl late chicke all my new stockings
my coverlet & two pillows,
Fourteenthly I give and bequeath unto my niece Lucia
Fohl my breast pin and the middle of a quilt,
Fifteenthly I give and bequeath unto my nephew Edmond
Fohl one silver tea spoon,
Sixteenthly I give and bequeath unto my nephew William
Fohl one silver tea spoon,
Seventeenthly I give and bequeath unto my niece Julia
Fohl my German hymn book,
Eighteenthly I give and bequeath unto Selma Spack
daughter of David and Fredericka Spack of Stokes County
North Carolina my German bible,
Nineteenthly I give and bequeath unto Maria Hem
of Salem, Stokes County North Carolina one blue
pomegran blanket,
Twentiethly I give and bequeath unto my mother Elizabeth
Fohl and unto my two sisters Fredericka and Sophia
Fohl the remainder of my clothes, goods and chattles
to be divided among them, my mother having the first
choice,
Twentyfirstly I hereby appoint my brother, Samuel
Thomas Fohl of Salem Stokes County, North Carolina

Jr. of Stokes County and State of North Carolina being
blessed with common health sound mind memory &
understanding praised be God for it & considering
the certainty of death and the uncertainty of the time
thereof and to the end I may be the better prepared
to leave this world whenever it shall please God
to call me hence I do therefore make and declare
this my last will and Testament in manner following
that is to say,
First and principally I commend my soul into the
hands of Almighty God my creator, hoping for free
pardon and remission of all my sins through the
merits of Jesus Christ my Saviour my body I commit
to the earth to be buried in a Christian manner
without pomp and vanity, my desires is if I
lie in this County to be buried in the same

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grave yard with Mother, my coffin must be of cherry
plank worth \$12. my Tomb Stone must be worth \$12
or \$14 like unto Mother's and the grave yard to be kept
paid in as the dissection of my Executors, hereafter mentioned
I will that all my just debts shall be by me owing at
my death together with my funeral expenses and all charges
touching the proving of or otherwise concerning this my will
shall in the first place out of my estate and effects be
fully paid and satisfied and from and after payment
thereof and subject thereto, then my will is if I die
without a lawful heir that all the residue of my goods
things, chattels, merchandise, and house hold furniture
together with all my lands tenements and negroes and
all other property whatsoever belonging to my estate
and also all my write title and interest of my
Father's estate which is two shares in the estate my
will is that all the above named property and money
bonds and notes and all that belongs to my estate
shall be equally divided between my Brother James
and Sister to wit, brother James Gimmormann Sister
Susannah widow of Leonard Pinnegar of Tennessee, Sister
Leannah wife of Simeon Sister Elizabeth wife of
Philip Barrow the above named property shall to the
four above named persons, James, Susannah, Leannah & Elizabeth
to be equally divided between them share and share alike
the above named estate shall be sold and twelve months
enact and when the money becomes due it shall be
collected and divided equally between James, Susannah,
Leannah & Elizabeth share and share alike, And I
do hereby make and ordain James Gimmormann, Susannah
Pinnegar, Simeon & Philip Barrow Executors of this
my last will and Testament In witness whereof
I set my hand and seal this 4th day of December 1838
