 will and Testament

I give and bequeath unto my wife Margaret
 the sum of one hundred and fifty dollars
 to be paid her at the death of me or of her

William Richard George & Archibald Bowman my sons
 all my Lands and Tenements lying on the south
 branch of Blue Creek with all my Chattels houses
 and all my farming Utensils to be equally divided
 among them my four sons to be possessed by them
 and their heirs forever But I will that George
 & Archibald my two youngest sons is not have their
 share of the Estate till they come of age but is
 to be kept in the hands of my executors till they are
 of age then to be delivered to them in full without
 fraud a delay for them and their heirs to possess
 forever

I will that if any one of my sons do improve any part
 of my land the improvement that he does or work to be his
 own and not to be called any part of my Estate but
 he is to have and hold it him and his heirs forever
 and his lot of the land shall be where he has
 improved

I give to my loving wife Margaret one horse and all
 my household furniture

Item My Executors may put my son George and Archibald to
 learn a trade if it shall be judged good

I give to my loving wife Margit her Land and all that
 pertains thereto but good hours one fourth of household
 furniture to be enjoyed and possessed by her and her
 heirs forever

I send to my loving wife Margit one half
 all my household furniture and a privilege
 of living on the aforesaid place with
 my sons & there to be supported by my
 four sons and nourished with a reason-
 able livelihood as long as she remains
 a widow but if she marries again the
 my four sons is to find her no longer
 she is to move off of the place & have
 more privilege therefrom and is to give
 my four sons all that I had her to
 be divided among them

I nominate and appoint my loving wife
 & my two sons William & Richard to be my
 only and sole Executors of this my last
 Will and Testament recalling and dis-
 annulling all other Wills legacies & bequests
 made by me before now ratifying and con-
 firming this and no other to be my last
 Will and Testament In witness whereof
