

In the name of God Amen:

I Elizabeth Carter being of sound mind and memory do make and set forth this my last will and Testament. That is to say -

Item first. I will and devise that all of my just debts be paid by my executor herein after named out of my estate.

Item second. My will & desire is that all money on hand or due me at my death be equally divided between my children to wit, Landon Carter, William Carter, Mahala Vaughan, James Carter & the heirs of Benjamin H. Carter shall constitute one legatee and draw from my estate what their father the said Benjamin H. Carter would be entitled to draw as a legatee of my estate, and the heirs of John Carter shall also constitute one legatee & draw from my estate that portion which their father the said John Carter would be entitled to draw as a legatee in my estate, with the provisions herein after named as to Martha Ann Bailey.

Item third as I have given all of my children beds & furniture with the exception of my son Benjamin H. Carter, it is my will and desire that my executor pay his heirs the sum of twenty five dollars out of my estate in lieu of his bed.

Item fourth. It is my will and desire that all my negro slaves be equally divided between my six above named legatees, viz, Landon Carter, William Carter Mahala Vaughan, James Carter, the heirs of Benjamin H. Carter being one legatee, and the heirs of John Carter being one legatee, with the provisions herein after named as to Martha Ann Bailey. It is further my will that the above named negroes be sold and divided between the above named six legatees of my estate and those drawing the slaves of higher value, shall pay to those drawing slaves of lesser value so as to make their respective shares all of equal valuation.

Item fifth. I will & devise unto all of my legatees all of the property of whatever description that I have given them heretofore.

Item sixth. I will and devise that all of my property of whatever description not otherwise named in this my last will and testament be sold by my

executor and equally divided between my six above named legatees with the following provisions as to Martha Ann Bailey Item seventh. I give and devise to my son William Carter all the slaves and property of whatever description which my Grand daughter Martha Ann Bailey is entitled to draw as a legatee through her father John Carter of my estate to have and to hold in Special trust for the sole and entire part for the separate use of my Grand daughter the said Martha Ann Bailey for and during the term of her natural life and free from the debts, liabilities or engagements of her husband Edward J. Bailey and it is my will and desire that at the death of my Grand daughter Martha Ann Bailey the property above will'd to her by me shall be equally divided between her heirs share and share alike.

Lastly I do hereby name and appoint my son William Carter Executor of this my last will and testament hereby revoking and declaring null all other wills and testaments by me heretofore made.
