4.) 5.) And I do hereby make constitute & appoint my Trusty friends John Daniels & my wife Salome Executors of this my last will & Testament who are to pay all my debts & settle all my accounts & they shall have full power to sell the same for the sale of my personal property when they shall find the same most convenient

6.) Whom I have been hitherto Guardian & executor of the children of my deceased Daughter Mary Hogler I hereby appoint George Legenow in my place as Guardian for the said children during their minority and do hereby disannul & make void all my former wills & bequests done by me either in writing or by word of mouth ratifying and confirming this to be my last will & Testament In witness whereof I have hereunto put my hand & seal this twenty second day of April in the year of our Lord ~~1802~~

I Elizabeth Goslin of the County of Stokes aforesaid Widow being in good health and of sound Memory thanks be given to the goodness of Almighty God, calling unto mind the mortality of man and knowing it is he destined for all men one to die do make and ordain this my last will & Testament by Principally and first of all I give and recommend my soul into the hands of all mighty God who gave it and my body to be buried in usual burial at the direction of my Executors

and as touching such worldly Estate wherewith I
 have pleased God to bless me in this life I give remain &
 dispose of the same in manner & form following viz
 First I give and bequeath to my trusty friend John
 Paddyewest ten my negro Samuel in Trust for the use
 and benefit of my beloved friend Nancy Slater wife of
 Henry Slater during her natural life and at her decease
 I bequeath the said negro Samuel to any Paddyewest wife
 of said John for ever.

Secondly And whereas I have hitherto sold one of my negroes
 named Peta to Mr. Marshall Esq. for the sum of one
 hundred & fifty pounds hard money to be paid in yearly pay-
 -ments of Ten pounds ~~every~~ every year, and whereof the last
 payment was made on the Michaelmas day ~~and~~ the year
 one thousand seven hundred & ninety nine, of which sum I
 have given six payments in all sixty pounds unto my
 beloved friend Henry Slater for part of my & my Daughter's
 Maintenance and whereas Henry Slater has since the year
 1792 maintained me & my Daughter Elizabeth till he
 became the 2^d of December 1798 to my satisfactions and
 has promised and agreed to do the same unto me untill my
 decease therefore in consideration of the above negro Samuel
 I hereby declare that Henry Slater & his heirs & assigns
 shall not be charged by my heirs or Executors for said negro
 Samuel nor for said forty pounds as I have received full
 satisfaction by the Maintenance of me and my Daughter
 as aforesaid

Thirdly As for the remainder of my personal estate as
 much as I have shall leave of the same undisposed of
 at my decease and the sum of five pounds according
 to a note of hand from Daniel Smith for Cattle & my

Will is, that it shall be divided in four equal shares of which
 I give and bequeath one entire share to my grand Children
 of my deceased Daughter Mary Young, one entire share to my
 Daughter Catherine wife of Daniel Smith, one entire share
 to my Grandson of my deceased Daughter Tabinas Cabe
 and one entire share to my son John & his heirs any of
 them to whom the above shares are hereby given and
 bequeathed be dead before my departure I leave Children
 then such Children shall take the share of the deceased
 parent in equal shares but in case one has left no
 Children the Executors are to receive that share

Fourthly And I do hereby ordain constitute & appoint
 my beloved & trusty friends Hattie Hamelton and Adam
 Elrod Executors of this my last Will Testament & do hereby
 utterly disannull and make void all my former Wills
 or Legacies done by me either in writing or by word
 of mouth ratifying and confirming this and no
 other to be my last Will & Testament

 Know all men by these presents that I Hugh McIlhenny of the County of Stokes and State of North Carolina being sick and weak of body but of perfect mind memory and knowing that it is appointed for all men once to die do make and ordain this my last Will & Testament, that is first I recommend my soul to the hand of God that gave it not doubting but I shall receive the same again at the general resurrection by the mighty power of God and as touching such worldly estate as it has pleased God to bless me with I do dispose of them in the following manner First I will & bequeath to my beloved wife Agnes the third part of my Estate real and personall after paying any just debts & public charges I further Will & bequeath to her that hundred acres land that lies in Guilford County which he in full of her share of the land by her to be freely possessed and enjoyed & the two hundred acres that lies in Stokes County it is my will that be sold at the discretion of my executors but if it cannot be sold to advantage so as to support the Widow & children to work the land and then to receive the third part of the ^{proceeds} proceeds till such sale can be made I further will & bequeath to my Daughter Hanna or her heirs the sum of one Spanish Milled Dollar in full of their share I likewise will and bequeath

to the heirs of Elizabeth ~~the~~ late the Wife of Michael Fair the like sum of one Spanish Milled Dollar in full of their share and no more the remainder of my estate after deducting the Widows third then it is my will that it equally divided that and all shall share alike male or female this I publish and pronounce as my last will and testament revoking all others hitherto made or ordained signed sealed published pronounced in presence of
