16) It is my wish that each of the sisters in the colored I did live, may get a piece of Chinaware or something else in remembrance of me.

17) To my brother Benjamin in Orange County ten dollars.

18) To my sister Veronica Reich my bed and bedstead, chest and all my clothes, which she may divide amongst my relations at her pleasure. Likewise I give the bequest unto her all the rest & remainder of my estate which may be left after paying all my just debts & supplying my wishes herein expressed. I also bequeath unto her the legacy of my brother Michael & also the money business.
