

I Christina Dalton of the County of State, and State of North Carolina bring sound & mind, but weak in body do make this as my last will and testament in manner & form as follows, to wit:

Herm 1st: I will and bequeath to my son Charles B. Dalton One Dollar in Money -
Herm 3^d: I will and bequeath my son Isaac Dalton One Dollar in Money -

Herm 3rd: I will and bequeath to my son David Dalton One half of all my Cattle for six hundred & Thirty Dollars &c. dated Sept 8th 1860 On Condition that said sum is not to be settled at Once but that One hundred Dollars shall be required Annually to be paid - I further give to my son David A. Dalton One Negro Man Cattle which is to be held out by my Executor until my son David return, or is fully accounted that he is dead and should it be ascertained that David is no more than my Executor is to sell said Negro Cattle and the Money arising from the sale to be equally divided between my son Isaac B. Dalton, John A. B. Dalton & Christina Malaga Cale Share & Share alike -

Herm 4th: I will and bequeath to my son Tom F. Dalton One Dollar in Money and I bequeath to the Children living at my death of my son Tom F. Dalton my Negro boy Dick and girl Susan, which I wish my Executor to hire out Annually to the best advantage for the Benefit of said grand Children until he thinks it proper to make sale for division to be Share & Share alike -

Herm 5th: I will and bequeath to my daughter Christina Malaga Cale One dollar in Money and I further will unto the Children of Christina M. Cale One negro girl Sarah & one called Lucy and a boy called William to be equally divided between all my daughters Children share & share alike after the death of my said daughter C. M. Cale together with any increase that may be among said Negroes, also will to my grand daughter Christina Cale Daughter of C. McCall my dogger Cale, & I further will to my daughter all my wearing Clothing -
Herm 6th: I will and bequeath to my son John A. B. Dalton one negro girl now in his service in Calais Louisiana, my Cook & Secretary and One mahogany table at his house.

Herm 7th: I will and bequeath to my son Isaac B. Dalton all my farming tools, kitchen furniture, my side board and trunk, my back Smith Tools and fan bell and my negro boy Jerry to him and to his increase or Spouse and should my son Isaac B. Dalton depart this life without a son after his death to be equally divided between the Children of my daughter C. M. Cale, I further give to my son Isaac B. Dalton all he owes to me (about fifteen hundred Dollars) also my watch shall go to Caw.

Herm 7th: I will and bequeath to the grand Children of my son Isaac B. Dalton my negro woman Amelia and her Child Elsey together with any increase she may by them have - I further direct that all my property not herein disposed of shall be left to the right holder and after the payment of my debts all Cost & Charges and the Collection of what may be due me at my death not hereby bequeathed, I leave to my sons John A. B. Dalton & Isaac B. Dalton and request them to furnish a tombstone on my grave and my Daughters grave Benthematation. and finally I do hereby constitute my son John A. B. Dalton my Executor to this my last will and testament requiring of him to strictly carry out all my intentions in full according to the true intent and meaning of this my last will and testament hereby making all other by standers & witnesses to this testimony stand. I have hereunto set my hand and affixed my seal the 13 day of January 1863

The Execution of the last will and testament of Christina Dalton, ^{of which the foregoing is a True Copy,} was duly proved in open Court by Ammon G. Hill on his oath before the hand writing of the Subscribing witnesses C. C. Cole & H. E. Charles, also the hand writing of the testator Ephraim Baldwin, and, being so done to be recorded -

In Consequence of the uncertainty of human life, I Ephraim Baldwin (now Captl. Company 42nd Regt. N.C. Troops of the Cavalry etc.) being of sound mind do make the following will, or distribution of a portion of my property, effects, lands and tenements, goods and Chattels, as may be named in this will. To my Father Charles B. Baldwin I will my Gold watch (worn on my person) and all my Stock, hogs, cows, sheep etc.

2nd: I hereby appoint John T. Smith Esq. of the County and State above named, Executor of this will and testament. I instruct him to collect all notes due me from any one, and to pay out wages and take Charge of all Money left by me; and to discharge all duties imposed by law to an Executor. And to pay a note held against me (Ephraim Baldwin) by my Mother Mrs Dorothy P. Baldwin, of eleven hundred and Seven dollars, with interest from the 25th October 1861, and all other lawful debts held against me by any one. I further will that when all lawful debts shall have been paid, the remainder of the money shall be left about in safe hands with sufficient security. The Inte. about the Executor will pay annually to my Father and Mother jointly and equally, to use as they please, and to be paid as long as both so either may live, and after the demise of both, the Inte. and principle shall be paid to John Harrison Hendley now a private in Company A. 33rd Regt. N.C. Troops (of the 4th N.C. Cavalry and Company of Scotts) as the lawful inheritor. And in Case his death has occurred, it shall be equally divided among his widow if living, and all his lawful body heirs.

3rd: I further will to the said John Harrison Hendley (now) a member of Company A. 22nd Regiment N.C. Troops all of a piece or parcel of Land called for by the Deed on record, to him and to hold, and use his life time, and afterwards to be equally among all his lawful body heirs; said lands are situated partly on the North side of the Madison and Milling Road in side of Apertine and County of Stokes, joining the lands of Charles G. Clegg and the wife of Charles G. Clegg. I also will to the same persons and heirs and in the same way as last named above a 2nd piece or parcel of land, as called for by the deed, lying on the South side of the same road, and joining the lands of Charles B. Baldwin, William T. Smith, and William H. Rivers the acreage being about two hundred and fifty four acres more or less. The preceding is my true will and testament. Signed sealed and delivered, this 9th month of June, one thousand eight hundred & forty two (1862)
