

Hoke's County State of North Carolina being of sound mind and memory do make this my last will and testament in manners and form following. 1st It is my will that all my just debts be paid. 2nd I give & bequeath out of the money or moneys due me from the Rev. Theodore Thuley the sum of eight dollars to Dorotha Warner & to her successor or successors in title of the Manag^{mt} of the Salem Congregational Church poor fund in trust from to be by her or them applied or thought best & proper for said fund the sum I make in consideration of the many services I have received in said house and out of said poor fund I further give & leave for the use of the sick in the house my bed sheet - 3rd the residue of my dues in the hands of the aforesaid Theodore Thuley after deducting the aforesaid eight dollars shall be appropriated to my burial expenses which burial shall be held agreeable to the usage in Salem with a wish that simplicity may be used as to what regards my burial - 4th I give & bequeath to my sister Mary Shilton one of my black cloth cloaks - one brown Camlet one dark Calico one light Calico dress - 1 green checked handkerchief 1 white petticoat one spotted bed cover of cam one hand box & other bonnet one yellow blanket one dark apron one woolen frock & one printed counterpane not the darkest one - 5th I give & bequeath to my sister Catherine Shopp one of my best black cloaks one light colored & one green Calico dress one work handkerchief & green home made handkerchief one white petticoat also three checked bed covers my best hand box & silk bonnet my brown spotted silk handkerchief one dark checked apron one dyed apron two of my black a white one & one other also my best cap & band I further give to her one my woolen clothing stockings &c. not otherwise herein bequeathed also my dark striped dress which was once my mother's further a yellow checked counterpane & one pair of good cotton stockings & shoes I give to her all the residue of my sister Mary Shilton's bequeathed also my spinning wheel formerly my mother's - 6th To my niece Ann Maria Haines I give & bequeath 1 muslin dress one black silk handkerchief one Calico dress one feather bed two pillows one covering bed and two sheets my walnut chest one light brown silk handkerchief one dark printed counterpane & one pair of cotton stockings & 7th To my niece Sophia Hunter I give and bequeath one black figured blanket one small cupboard one black painted chest my best spinning wheel one dark apron one dark checked home made frock - 8th All my bedding not otherwise herein bequeathed I will that it be equally divided between my two sisters Mary Shilton & Catherine Shopp - 9th To Mr. Shilton my sister Mary's husband I give my small walnut chest and a spotted silk handkerchief 10th To Mary Smith of Salem I give my storm bed, a home made blanket of small figure a home made frock & a home made apron 11th I give to Barbara Lumbard two dollars in cash 1 Calico counterpane & a pair of spectacles 12th To my sister Mary Rank I give my long yellow handkerchief 13th To Catherine Rank I give a black flannel handkerchief

14th To Mr. Shore my nephew wife I give a red striped dress (Red & Blue) & to her daughter Betsy a red striped apron 15th To Paulina Shore I give a dark striped frock one sheet one towel one shift 16th To my sister Mary daughter Betty I give one home made frock & one sheet 17th I give the sum to my friends as named following to Elizabeth Poiringsham my floor reel to William Shad one red flannel plate to Catherine Rank a small glass bottle to Magdalena Haines one china cup & saucer & a little basket to Dorotha Warner a tea spoon to Mary Shilton a tea spoon to Cordelia Elabond a set glass bowl to Elizabeth Shad a china cup & saucer to Catherine Shad one sheet & a blue petticoat to Mary White a white petticoat ready cut out to Sally Watson a sheep trowel to Betty Potts a plate to the three sisters employed in the kitchen Elizabeth Reide Elizabeth Fooks and Rebecca Thuley jointly one apron of fine white muslin 18th I do further give & bequeath & place at the hands of Dorotha Warner the sum of thirteen dollars to be by her distributed agreeable to my verbal directions to her and for which she shall never be accountable to any of my legal heirs or to any person else - Lastly it is my will and I do hereby appoint my friend John Rank Merchant in Salem as my executor to the my last will & Testament & further that my intimate friends Mrs. Dorotha Warner and Mary Haines do assist my executor in dividing said distribution and the above articles according to this my last will and Testament made & signed this thirtieth day of June A.D. 1828

I Frederick Long of the County & State aforesaid being of perfect mind and memory do hereby make and give for my last will and testament the my last will and Testament in Manner & form as follows (to wit) 1st I will that my just debts be paid out of my estate 2nd I will that my beloved wife Mary Elizabeth Long shall live in this my house & plantation and her life or widowhood also that my children shall remain with me and subject of my wife and children with her in the house & plantation & shall have the same the same and the same

all the crop of the present year all the household & kitchen
furniture all my cooking tools two pair of young all the plantation & family
mine head of cattle nine sheep all the hogs which are living just now and
shall remain for the use and support of my wife & children who are
under age also two horses are to remain for the use of my wife & children
My children shall remain with my wife until they come of lawful
age also one gun is to remain with the family —
3^d I will that my little & filly appearing be sold and one wood work
of a wagon crop cut down all my tobacco except that pounds when
I give unto my wife Mary & Long all my cooking vessels one gun and
the horse cattle & sheep that are not left for the use of the family one
pair of young two broad bands to be sold after my death at public
Vendue 4th I will that when my youngest child shall be
of lawful age that all my personal property shall be sold at public
Vendue which was not sold at the first sale except such as two women
beds one chest one table one loom with all the young dogs & puppies
harry sporting wheel and reel one flax wheel one cotton wheel one
pair of cards one box one sheep one bag one bit some one tea kettle
two dishes two plates two knives & forks one coffee pot four crocks two pans
2 tea cups and saucers one bowl & flesh fork 1 coffee mill 1 coffee grinder
1 flour tub two tin cups two shell plates one mudbag 1 pair fine trays one
Horned one water bucket one milk pail one wood tub one wash pot
1 chow 1 chain one looking glass two shavers one bucket one can two
crock cutting one sausage gun one tray one candle stick two bread baskets
all the above named articles shall be given to my wife for her use
during her life or widowhood and at her death or death they shall return
to my children to be sold and equally divided among all my children
My wife is not at liberty to sell any of the articles above named
Neither shall it be liable to be sold by an officer for any debt contracted
by her also all the property left for the use of the family with the
tools farming utensils household and kitchen furniture are not to be
sold by any of the family Neither shall any of the above named
be liable to be sold by an officer for any debt contracted by my wife
and children 5th I will that when my youngest child shall come
of age that my executors shall choose two men who shall lay off one
acre provision for my wife and if they do not agree they two
shall choose a third 6th I will that when my youngest child
shall come of age that equal division shall be made of all my lands
among all my children and that my son Williams shall have the
young Bible and be charged three dollars for the same —
7th I will that when my son John Long comes of age he shall be in
to the land west of the dividing line made through my plantation
with exception that he pay one fifth part of all his money

to his mother as long as she lives or remains a widow except (20)
garden & other truck patching 8th I will that my youngest son
Olomon Long shall be him to all other lands on the East side of the
dividing line made through my plantation with the same exception
made in the 7th clause — 9th I will that my son Jacob
Long shall pay to his brother a fifth part of all he raises after one
year as long as he stays on the land or until my son Joseph Long
comes of age and take possession of the same with garden & truck
patching excepted 10th I will that the barrel of whiskey and
one barrel of brandy shall remain for the use and support of my wife
11th I will that after the death of my wife my land shall be
valued by two free holders the buildings they shall value at a
moderate valuation and then an equal division shall be made
among all my children which are in name Jacob Long &
Olomon Long William Long John Long and Thomas
Long who shall share equal in my whole estate except my two dogs
Ipe & Olomon who shall have twenty dollars each extra for
them having a staying one year longer than the other brother —
12th I will that my daughter Sarah shall have one bed one chest
one floor wheel & a cotton wheel which are to be valued and given to
her when she comes of age and charged to her as part of her
dower also I will that if any of my children who are under age
should want to ponder any articles at the first sale that my executors
shall allow them sufficient time to make payment also I will that
the division which I have made in my land between my two
sons Ipe & Olomon shall be a division between them the line being
as follows beginning at a black oak in the northern boundary line running
to the Meadow thence along the winding edge or it meaning to a poplar
thence to an apple tree thence to a stake thence near the still house thence
west to a stake thence north to a stake thence east to a stake thence north
to a stump thence to a tree near the shop thence along the road
keeping the corner of the road to the right hand of the cut line thence
boundary Lastly I appoint my trusty friend Joseph Drake and my late
son Thomas Long or my executors of this my last will and testament for
the benefit of my heirs to take care & dispose of and truly fulfill and
impartially to execute and recording all things I declare this to be my last
will and testament in manner above written
