

In the name of God Amen, I Katharina Hauwa of Stety County
in the state of North Carolina being weak in body but of perfect mind
and memory thanks to God do this day make my last will &
testament in manner following that is to say-

First I give and bequeath unto my son John Hauwa the
West part of my land whereon I now live that is from Philip
Robertson North West Corner due North to my east West line
the West part thereof to be his sole property forever

Second I give and bequeath unto my daughter Elizabeth
the East part of said land together with all the buildings
orchards and all appurtenances thereunto belonging to be her sole
property forever.

Third I give and bequeath unto my daughter Christiana wife
of Philip Robertson Forty eight dollars in a note with the interest
due thereon at my decease besides Twenty seven dollars to be
paid to her after my decease and my debts to be
her sole property forever

Fourthly I give and bequeath unto my daughter Anna
wife of Valentine Buckle Two notes the one bearing date the
twelfth the other the fifteenth of May 1798 together with the interest
due thereon at my decease to be her sole property forever.

Fifthly I give and bequeath unto my daughter Elizabeth all
my ready money and money due unto me besides my household
furniture and even articles of personal property not mentioned
here which shall and pertain to my deceased to be her sole
property forever provided she pay my funeral expences and
the Twenty seven dollars to my daughter Christiana as is mentioned
in the third paragraph

I Will that my son John Hauwa be my executor of
this my last will and testament

And I do hereby disannul all former wills and
testaments Ratifying and confirming this and no other to be
my last will and testament. In Witness whereof I have hereunto
set my hand and seal this twenty fourth of July 1817.

In the name of God Amen, I Fredrick Miller of Stety
County state of North Carolina being in a low state of health &
life is uncertain but being of sound and well disposing mind
and memory do make and ordain this my last will and
testament in the following manner and form

First I recommend my soul into the hands of Almighty God
my Creator & Preserver.

Secondly I commit my body to the earth to be decently buried
in a Christian manner.

Thirdly and concerning my worldly estate whomever
it hath pleased God to bless me in this life I dispose of in the
following manner.

First I give and bequeath unto my well beloved wife
Sarah my house and Mill and all my land belonging to the
Mill except my old tract as herein after mentioned, also a piece
of land at the head of the Mill pond beginning at the
head of the pond on the old line running an east corner
along the same Twenty rods then to run north corner with
the East line of the mill tract. also a piece of land named
Sarah. to have the sole use thereof as long as she lives
I also bequeath unto her as much of the stock and household
furniture as she may choose to keep.

Secondly. It is my will that my son Jacob is to have
the remaining part of my old tract of land whereon he

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now a leg at seven hundred Dollars.

Thirdly It is my will that if my son Friedrich Meador take the care of the Mill during the lifetime of my beloved wife Sarah that the down meadow in the old tract should belong to the Mill that my son Frederic may be able to furnish my said wife with feed sufficient to winter her stock but if my son Jacob should take the care of the mill during the lifetime of my beloved wife Sarah, then the above mentioned meadow is to belong to the tract whereon he lives and he shall furnish her with sufficient to winter her stock as long as she lives.

Fourthly It is my will that my beloved wife may keep as much of the property not herein mentioned as she chooses and have the use thereof her lifetime. It is also my will that the property that my wife will not choose to keep that the same be sold to her best advantage by my executors and the money arising therefrom to belong unto my wife during her lifetime.

Fifthly It is my will that after the decease of my beloved wife that the Mill and the land belonging thereto as above mentioned with the buildings thereon be valued by my executors unto my son Friedrich with the down meadow in the old tract, but if my son Friedrich should refuse to take it at the valuation It is my will that my son Jacob should take the same at the same valuation but if he refuse It is my will that the above mentioned meadow shall belong unto my son Jacob but the mill land and improvements thereon with all the property then remaining to be sold to the highest bidder and the money arising therefrom to be equally divided among my four children viz Jacob & Frederic Meador & Margaret Buffette & Elizabeth Garside. In case either of my sons

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should take the mill and land with the improvements thereon It is my will that an equal division be among all my children agreeable to valuation.

Lastly I appoint ordain and constitute my sons John Miller Jacob Miller and Frederic Miller executors of this my last will and testament to pay my just debts and collect my just credits all after the true meaning of this my last will and testament.
