burner, and small folding leaf table my cart, and
axens and one half of farming tools.
I will to my son Samuel of my walnut curtain braster
large folding leaf table, Blue effect, and blue cupboard
and the other half of the farming tools and a negro
boy name Peter
I will that all the property both real and personal that
I may have from my fathers estate to be equally divided
between my three children Mary, Gabriel & Samuel
and I also will that all my bed & bed clothing shall
be equally divided between them I will that my son
Gabriel and daughter Mary & son Samuel I shall be
made equal in their parts of my property and I will

that all the property and money that may be found
at my death not named in the will to be equally divided
between the three children I further more will that if
son Samuel & I have to the sum of negroes I made
with Ruthenia Edge & her child for a negro girl named
Martha Ruthenia Blackburn given me four hundred dollars
to boot to have of my property as the will direct above
but if he does not I will that he shall receive no
part of my property whatever I constitute nominate
& appoint my truly friend John W. Hampton of
Town Fork and of Stokes County as executor to this
my last will & testament made this 9th of April
1843 signed in the presence of the subscribers witness

portion with the rest of my Children out of my estate to be

hers and at her Disposal forever Fourthly I give and Devise
to my beloved wife Ruth all the remainder of my property
