

Brown all men by these presents that I George Deatherage of the State of North Carolina & County of Stokes for and in consideration of the sum of fourtene pounds to him in hand paid the witness of the said George Deatherage do herby con-<sup>227</sup>fess and acknowledge haue bargained & sold by these presents do bargain sell & deliue unto John Martin of the State and county aforesaid one negroe girl named Fanny about fourtene years of age which said negroe girl named Fanny was by these presents warrant and deputie unto the said John Martin from the claim or demand of any person or persons whatsoever claiming a to claims by from or under him the said George Deatherage. Provided nevertheless if the said George Deatherage do pay unto the said John Martin the sum of fourtene pounds at or upon the first monday in may next than the bill of sale and delivery to null & void otherwise if the money is not paid by the first monday in may next the said negroe girl is to continue in the possession of the said John Martin until the fifth day of October next then to be at the option of the said John Martin to keep the said negroe & pay unto the said George Deatherage sealy five pounds to be paid one half in cash including the fourtene pounds and the other half in

properly such as a good waggon & his litter at cash price further in case the the said John Martin do not chuse to keep the said negroe girl at sealy five pounds and the said Deatherage refuse to pay up the ~~juste value~~<sup>227</sup> the above sum of fourtene pounds the bill of sale and delivery is to have its effect so far as to empower the said John Martin to make sale of the aforesaid negroe for the best price that can be got and pay the sum of fourtene pounds and the overplus return to the said Geo. Deatherage.
