4th It is my will that my negro boy Garrison be hired
out from year to year until my youngest child be
comes of age the proceeds of which if required is to
go to support my children. after that he is to be sold
to the best advantage and the money to be equally divided
among my children. the heirs of my wife Lezanne
5th I authorize & empower my executor to sell a certain
tract of land lying in east Tennessee Jefferson County
containing Eighty acres in two Tracts one for 30 and the other
for fifty acres to the best advantage and the money to
be applied as the other property.

Lastly I will that all my last debts be paid.
I also make & ordain my worthy friend W^m Hall
executor of this my last will and Testament. In witness
