- 1) I will that all my just debts & funeral expenses be duly paid
- 2) I give and bequeath all my property both real & personal which
I hold & possess by virtue of my office as warden for the Congre-
gation in Salem appraised to my beloved friend Lewis Dr. Johnson
who shall receive the same every part thereof consisting in
lands, slaves, bonds, notes, book accounts, cash or whatsoever the
same may be for the use of my successor in office
- 3) I give & bequeath to my beloved daughter Anna Louisa twelve
dollars which I own in the State Bank of North Carolina &
one moiety of the money for which I stand as creditor in
Fols County (Salem Parish)
- 4) I give & bequeath unto my beloved daughter Susanna Elizabeth
nine dollars which I own in the State Bank of North
Carolina and one moiety of the money for which I stand
creditor in the Parish in the Salem (Salem Parish)
- 5) The remainder of my personal property I will that both my
beloved daughters divide the same between themselves according to the
true value thereof & stand alike

6) I make and appoint my beloved friends Lewis Dr. Johnson
Frederic K. Manning & Jacob Blum all of Salem appraisers
to be the executors of this my last will & Testament I witness
whereof I the said Samuell Stots have to this my last
will & Testament set my hand & seal this 4th day of
September AD one thousand eight hundred & twenty
thirteen sealed & delivered by
the said Samuell Stots as upon his last
will & Testament in the presence of
us who were present at the signing
& sealing thereof

 of James Lutz and fifty dollars to have & to hold forever

Third I do hereby appoint my son John Lutz my executor
 of this my last Will & Testament & I do hereby entirely
 dissolve revoke & make void all former wills by me
 heretofore made Relieving & confirming this & no other
 to be my last Will & Testament
