- 4) I give & bequeath unto my beloved daughter Susanna Elizabeth
Nine Dollars which I own in the State Bank of North
Carolina and one moiety of the money for which I stand
creditor in the Broth in the Salem (Diasony)
- 5) The remainder of my personal property I will that both my
beloved daughters divide the same between themselves according to
their value there & stand alike

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6) I make and appoint my beloved Friends Lewis Dr. Schumann
Frederic K. Minning & Jacob Blum all of Salem aforesaid
