

351 In the Name of God Amen, I Jacob Conrad a Citizen of Stokes County State of North Carolina, being of sound mind and Memory but knowing that it is appointed for all men once to die, and being in a weak State of health I do make this my last will & testament—

It is my will that after my death my body shall be interred in the usual manner and the expenses thereof to be paid by my Executor herein after named.

It is my desire that my son William shall pay unto my son Frederic the sum of two hundred and fifty dollars, and to my grand daughter Burrella Elvira two hundred & fifty dollars when she arrives at the age of eighteen years without interest that being the amount I have heretofore paid unto my son-in-law Salomon Haller who married my daughter Mary Susannah— Two hundred & fifty dollars being all that I can bequeath unto each of my children (excepting William)— I bequeath unto my son William after my death for himself and his heirs forever all my stock of Horses, cattle, sheep, hogs, stiles, tubs, keys, waggon, farming tools, and all and every article of personal property of whatever denomination I may be possessed of in any way or wise also all dues and demands that may be due to me at my death also all my real estate consisting of four different tracts of land & premises to wit, One ^{tract} conveyed to me by the heirs of Chas. Conrad by deed dated 11th of January A.D. 1812 Registered in book No 5 folio 538 containing 1762 acres, One tract conveyed to me from the State dated Dec 24th A.D. 1796 Registered in book B folio 350 containing forty six & one half acres— One tract from the heirs of Chas. Conrad dated 11th day of January A.D. 1812 Registered in book No 5 folio 531 containing forty six acres & 108 perches and one tract the third part of seven acres together with all my interest in the oil mill—

It is my desire that in consideration of what I have hereby bequeathed unto my son William that he shall pay all my just debts— and the right of the land shall be liable for the payment of the Legacy herein bequeathed unto my son Frederic & grand daughter Burrella Elvira the part to my son Frederic shall be due an demand—

I hereby appoint my son William my Executor of this my last will & testament and I do hereby revoke & annul all former wills; In testimony whereof I have hereunto set my hand and affixed my seal this 2^d day of December A.D. 1836 signed & sealed in presence of Wm. H. Wilson & Geo. H. Wilson

Be it known to all whom it may concern that I Jacob Conrad on this day March the twenty second in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred & forty eight do make declare this as my will in relation to the distribution of my property, touching the divisions and time of payment heretofore made, to wit, my grand daughter Burrella Elvira not to have her portion until she is twenty one years of age— and out of the amount which is before specified as going to her she is to pay back to my son William twenty five dollars and the same is to be done by my son Frederic, that is my son William is to retain the sums mentioned in his hands for himself agreeably to a Bond I gave him dated Feb. 28th 1847

I am at my request and given under my hand and seal in the presence of who were called on to witness the same: the day and year above mentioned
