Executors —
Secondly. I give unto my beloved wife Louisa
Two houn my house flock & all her & his farm
Thirdly It is my will that my land & plantation

containing one hundred acres shall by my executor
or either of them be sold out & the moneys so bargained
for shall be & come to the sole use & benefit of my
said beloved wife Louisa during her widowhood
and at the determination of her widowhood or when
the said one hundred acres shall be sold by my
executor or either of them or the survivor of them
by public or private sale & they or either of them shall
be competent to make a lawful conveyance for the
same. The money arising on such sale shall be
divided into six equal parts if my said wife Louisa
is alive & she and my first Children Frederick, Ann Mary,
Henry, Jacob and Louisa shall have each one share
so that they all have share & than alike but if my
said wife is dead when the land is sold the proceeds
of such sale shall be equally divided among my
above named Children share and share alike

All the rest & residue of my estate real &
personal not herein before specially bequeathed I
desire to be sold by my executor or either of them by
public or private sale and on receipt of the money
on the sale arising my said executor shall divide
the same equally & pay the same in equal portions
share and share alike to my said wife Louisa & my
Children Frederick, Ann Mary, Henry, Jacob & Louisa.

wherein I now live containing four hundred
acres be the same more or less to my four
sons Vezt Peter Jacob John & William to be
divided in the following manner

first I give to my son Jacob Ludwick one fourth
of my land to be laid off on the south side
of the Creek joining Michael Pulps
