day of June in the year of our Lord one thousand
seven hundred and ninety four, I Jacob Mayer of
the town of Salem in the County of Stokes being low
and weak in body but of perfect mind & memory and
knowing that it is allotted for all men once to die do
make and ordain this to be my last Will & Testament
First I recommend my soul into the hands of Almighty God
that gave it me; and my body to be committed to the
earth in a Christian like burial at the discretion of my
executors hereafter named. And as to my worldly Estates
I dispose of it in the following manner

- 1, I lend to my beloved son Phillip Jacob Mayer
my large German Bible for my grandchild Henry
Mayer to be his own during his life.
- 2, I give and bequeath to my beloved son Samuel
Mayer my Silver Watch forever
- 3, I give and bequeath to my beloved daughter
Dorotha Mayer my Harpsicord forever
- 4, I give and bequeath to my beloved wife
Dorotha Mayer all the remainder of my Estate
of whatsoever nature whatsoever that are not
herefore bequeathed and shall belong to my
said beloved wife Dorotha Mayer during her
life and from and after the decease of

my will that the remaining part of the
Estate shall be divided between my children

child John Kraupe to be his forever.
