In the name of God. Amen. This twenty ninth day
of August One thousand seven hundred and ninety
four. I James Gamwell of the County of Stokes
State of North Carolina being sick & weak in
body but of Perfect mind and Memory
for which I bless God do make and ordain
this as my last will & Testament; that is to say
I give my soul into the hands of Almighty

God and my body to the earth
to be buried in a Christian man
at the discretion of my Executors
I do give & bequeath unto my Daughter
my beloved wife the sum of Fifty pounds
Gold and Silver money lawfully at
the rate of North Carolina with her
bed and saddle with all the clothes
I do give and bequeath to my
son William Gamwell the sum of
pounds Gold or Silver with his Gun
Saddle Bridle and Horns I do
and bequeath to my son Andrew
Gamwell the sum of Fifty pounds
or Silver money at the rate of North
with his Gun Saddle Bridle Horns. I
do give and bequeath to my son James
Gamwell the sum of Forty pounds Gold
and Silver money at the rate of North
with a saddle and the herd filly. I do
to my Daughter Betty the sum of Forty
pounds Gold or Silver money at the rate
of North Carolina with the saddle and
her share I do give and bequeath to

my Daughter Peggy fifty pounds Gold or Silver
counted at the rate of North Carolina with
her Saddle and bed. I dem I give and
bequeath to my son Joseph Gammell the
sum of thirty five pounds Gold or Silver
counted at the rate of North Carolina I dem
I give & bequeath to my son Samuel Gammell
the sum of thirty five pounds counted at
the rate of North Carolina I dem I give and
bequeath unto the child whether male or
female which my wife Lucretia is now
pregnant with the sum of thirty five
pounds counted at the rate of North Carolina
in Gold or Silver. And I will that after the
sale of my Estate is made which I hereby
direct my executor to do and the above
Legacies paid out of the amount of such
sale And whatever sum or sums of money
may remain that it be equally divided between
my wife Lucretia and all the rest of the above
mentioned Legacies Also I ordain and
appoint my beloved son William Gammell
& Andrew Gammell together with my

beloved wife Lucretia my Executors
 this my last Will and testament com-
 =ly recommending to each of them full-
 =ly and peaceably to fulfill the trust
 a father and husband before me
 And I do most solemnly hereby ratify
 Publish and declare this and not
 to be my last Will and testament
 Signed with my hand and sealed with
 my seal on the day of the date
