last Will and Testament

First I do hereby appoint and constitute my  
trusts and beloved friends John Holland  
and Jacob Wolfart both of Salem in  
the County of Surry aforesaid to be jointly  
my lawful executors of this my last Will  
& Testament and I do hereby ordain that  
they pay all my lawful Debts and  
funeral expenses

I also give and bequeath unto my said  
executors John Holland and Jacob Wolfart  
all my Cash Chest and Clothings together  
with all my personal Estate Bills books  
and agreements to be collected and brought  
by them in one Sum and the same to  
be equally divided into three equal

parts the first part thereof to be paid <sup>to</sup>  
my beloved sister Mary Hurst in Duchesfield  
if she be alive and if not then the same  
shall be paid to the children of my brother  
Samuel Hurst. The second part thereof to be  
paid to my God-son John Frederick Holland  
of Salem aforesaid as soon as he shall  
be of age or to his heirs executors or  
administrators And the third part shall be  
divided into two equal parts, one part of  
them for the benefit of the Single Brethrens  
Diacony and the other part for the Single  
Sisters Diacony in Salem aforesaid  
Lastly, I do hereby revoke all and every Will  
Wills by me heretofore made touching and  
confirming this and no other to be my last Will  
and Testament In Witness whereof I have here  
unto set my hand and seal this fifth Day of  
April in the year of our Lord One thousand seven  
hundred and Eighty five

 of North Carolina being very sick & weak in  
 body but of perfect mind and memory thank  
 be given unto God calling unto mind the  
 mortality of my body & knowing that it  
 is appointed for all men once to die do  
 make and ordain this my last will &  
 Testament that is to say principally (and  
 first of All) I give and recommend my soul  
 unto the hand of Almighty God that gave it  
 and my body I recommend to the earth  
 to be buried in a decent Christian burial
