

By the grace of God amen I James Jackson in being sound and in the province of North Carolina being sick in body but in my perfect senses and memory do give & bequeath to my loving wife Frances Jackson the Hundred acres of land on the waters of Beon islands and joining John Robinson line and including both plantations and one hundred on the waters of Buffalo Creek joining James Jacksons jan^r line and William Moor line and all my household furniture during her life and after her death the one hundred acres of land on Beon islands with both plantations to Samuel Crawley and the other hundred that joining of William Moor line to Henry Crawley and four hundred acres of land on Hickory Creek joining John Hensley line and Abraham Clarkson line to Thomas Crawley & for my two sons & four Daughters to them and each of them I give & bequeath one thousand Sterling I being in my perfect senses and memory do make this my last will & Testament

Given under my hand this 6th day of January 1789.

Secondly Having received from the Estate of my late father a certain sum of money twelve pounds Maryland Currency whereof I have only in hand the remainder being in the hands of my Brother Ephraim Colver now a late of the State of New Jersey I give & bequeath unto my brothers Sisters, namely unto the said Ephraim Colver Anna Strodes and Mary Hunsicker the said twelve pounds there and there alike.
