

By the grace of God amen I James Jackson in being found and in the province of North Carolina being sick in body but in my perfect senses and memory do give & bequeath to my loving wife Francis Johnson one Hundred acres of land on the waters of Beon islands and joining John Robinson line and including both plantations and one Hundred on the waters of Buffalo Creek joining James Jacksons jan^r line and William Moor line and all my household furniture during her life and after her death the one Hundred acres of land on Beon islands with both plantations to Samuel Casley and the other Hundred that joining of William Moor line to Henry Casley and four Hundred acres of land on Hickory Creek joining John Hensley line and Abraham Chalkers line to Thomas Casley & for my two sons & four Daughters to them and each of them I give & bequeath one Thilling Sterling I being in my perfect senses and memory do make this my last will & Testament
