 in the year of our Lord one thousand seven
 hundred and ninety nine make and cause
 publish this my last Will & Testament in man
 and form following.

First I give and bequeath unto Edmund
 Lee William Lee with Joseph and Sam
 Campbell of Stokes County and George
 McHenry jun^r Reuben McDaniel and
 Thavane Jones of Guilford County my neg
 ro man named Aaron and my nego girl
 named Megg during the natural lives of the
 said, seven persons and in case of the death
 of one or more of said persons before the
 deaths of said Negroes, Parts (in each one)
 that they the said Aaron & Megg remain
 be the property of the survivors (and not to
 descend to the heirs of the Decedent) untill
 their number shall be reduced to four then
 I will that the said Aaron & Megg be their
 property & their heirs forever

2^d I give and bequeath unto my son
 in law Charles Clayton a certain key

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 to him & his heirs, children of his
 wife Nancy my daughter forever
 3^d I will that my just Bills and funeral
 charges be paid out of my personal Estate
 not yet bequeathed

4th I give and bequeath unto my son James
 Doan the sum of five Shillings

5th I give and bequeath unto Edmund
 Lee William Lee with Joseph and James
 Campbell of Stokes County and George McHenry
 Reuben McDaniel and Thavane Jones of Guilford
 County a Small Cattle (commonly called Aaron
 folks to them & their heirs forever.

6th I will that the remainder of my personal
 Estate not heretofore bequeathed after all my just
 debts and funeral charges are paid be equally
 divided into three equal parts & shares, one
 part or share I give and bequeath unto my
 son James Doan, another part or share I give and
 bequeath unto my son in law Charles Clayton
 and Nancy his Wife and the third and
 last part or share I give and bequeath
 unto the children of my son John Doan
 by my daughter in law Ruth Doan to be
 equally divided among them.

And I do hereby make and declare my son
 James Doan Executor of this my last will
 & Testament. And I do hereby utterly revoke
 disannul and make void all former

Will and Testament by me at any
time times heretofore made, ratifying, confirming
and confirming this to be my last
will and Testament

In Witness whereof I the said
James have to this my last will
Testament set my hand and affixed my
seal day and year above written
