11<sup>th</sup> Lastly I constitute make & ordain Francis Rivers my sole  
Executor of this my last will & Testament and confirming  
it ratify this & no other to be my last will & Testament

harmonium & one of my new painted chairs.

3. It is my will that my sons Frederick Bushhead & John Bushhead  
& each of them alike have the use of my crop cut saw, bar  
hackle, gongstone & Pepper mill to themselves & their heirs  
forever.

4. I give & bequeath to my daughter Caroline Beale the  
madrass in my bed formerly belonging to her mother,  
my watch & silver snuff box, the table in my room,  
my silver table spoons, frame looking glass, & one of my  
old painted chairs, ~~which~~ <sup>the</sup> ~~same~~ <sup>long</sup> time ~~long~~ <sup>time</sup> ~~ago~~ <sup>ago</sup>  
& also the sum of seventy five dollars above her share  
which sum I request my Executors to pay out to her  
out of the first monies coming into their hands in consideration  
for her services done me in keeping house.

5. I give & bequeath to my son Frederick & to his heirs forever  
my bed furniture all my clothing & linen, my corner  
cupboard my desk & my large chair, my chair with the  
leather cushion, one of my chairs painted red, my writing  
apparatus, one cutlery box & what belongs to it, one silver  
tea spoon marked with my name.

6. I give & bequeath to my grand child Maria Elizabeth  
Bushhead & her heirs forever, my clock & looking glass  
if she should die before she has arrived at the age  
of twenty one years then to her parents John & Charlotte  
Frederica Bushhead.

7. It is further my will that if any one of my before mentioned  
children would wish to have my carriage he or she who  
takes it shall pay out to the other two the sum of thirty  
Dollars share & share alike, but if either of them should  
die leaving it, in that case my executors shall sell the  
same either at private or public sale & the sum of the

than & than alike.

8<sup>o</sup>. It is further my will that after deducting the above sum to me  
seventy five dollars be required, Caroline Brata the rest of  
my money be divided equally among my children. viz

to my son Christian Freddie Bunkhead & my daughter  
Charlotte Frederica intermarried with John Butler &  
Caroline Brata or to their heirs than & than alike

9<sup>o</sup>. It is further my express will, that whereas the said  
John Butler received already of me the sum of two  
hundred dollars, for which he gave me his note the further  
sum of two hundred dollars to pay out to him by my executors  
which sum of four hundred dollars is to be deducted out of  
the third part coming to him & the balance of said third part  
be put out on interest by my executors for the sole use of  
my grand child Maria Elizabeth Butler & that after said  
Elizabeth shall have arrived at the age of twenty one years my  
executors pay to her the whole principal & interest, should  
my daughter Charlotte Frederica intermarry with John  
Butler have one or more children than it is my will that the  
balance of said third part put on interest be divided among them than &  
than alike & each child to receive his proportion than when  
ever it attains to the age of twenty one years.

10<sup>o</sup>. my will & desire is that my above named three children divide  
amongst themselves than & than alike the residue of my property  
and lastly I do hereby constitute & appoint my son Christian  
Freddie Bunkhead & my trusty friend Charles Brant my lawfull

between my father and brother and sisters than & than  
alike I further will that if my said wife do not  
live that at her decease my Executor sell said land  
and divide the proceeds arising therefrom as herefore  
mentioned in this Item.

Item 3<sup>o</sup>. I also will and bequest to my beloved wife my  
horse Davy my wagon, one side saddle, one bridle, one  
fallen leaf table, my clock, Two cows and calves, one  
cow & eight sheep, my glass light cupboard and its contents,  
all my cooking vessels, two beds, heads of furniture, her  
choice, that be steady, one set of knives & forks, one  
small table that her mother bought & gave her, one  
good and sufficient set of farming tools such as plow  
hoe, harrow, mattock &c &c &c. Also I will that in  
addition to the articles mentioned in this Item that my  
said wife have a good and sufficient provision for one  
year after my death allotted to her out of my present crop  
and that George Swindell, George T Gulp and Aaron Brown  
lay off and allot, to my said wife the same, it is also my  
will that the articles all of them mentioned in this Item  
belong to my said wife to dispose of as she may think best

be complied with that my executor sells all the best and  
nisiens of my property of whatsoever denomination or  
kind and after paying all just debts and charges, that  
I carried the monies arising from the proceeds of the sale of
