 Mortality of my body, knowing that it is appointed for
 all men once to die; do make & ordain this my last Will
 I give & recommend my soul unto the hand of Almighty
 God that give it. My body I recommend to the Earth
 to be buried in decent Christian burial; at the direction
 of my Executors: nothing doubting but at the general
 resurrection I shall receive the same again; by the
 mighty power of God. And as touching such worldly
 Estate wherewith it has pleased God to bless me in
 this life; I give devise and dispose of the same in the
 following manner & form

First I give & bequeath to my wife my dear & beloved wife
 one Feather bed & Furniture; one woodbine Chest &
 five pounds hard money to be paid by Nathaniel
