

971 I John Francis, Sr. of the County of Stokes and State of North Carolina, being of sound mind and memory, knowing the certainty of death and the uncertainty of life, do make and publish this as my last will and testament revoking all wills & testaments by me heretofore made - First. My will and desire is that all my just debts and burial expenses shall paid by my Executor to be hereafter named, out of any monys that may first come into his hands, as a part or parcel of my estate - Secondly. I will and bequeath to my beloved wife Nancy P. Francis, the house tract of land on which I now live, consisting of Four hundred and Thirty-Eight Acre, to have and to hold the same during her natural life, also the household and kitchen furniture of every kind or description, I also will her the present growing crops - Thirdly. I will and bequeath to my wife Nancy P. Francis my horses, mules, cattle, hogs & sheep or as much of said stock as she may desire to keep up the farm with - Fourthly. I will and bequeath to my son Jas Jr. Francis Two hundred acres of land to be laid off at the North side of the tract, subject to the life estate of my wife as directed in a former will, and to hold the same in fee simple forever - Fifthly. I will and bequeath to my youngest daughter Augusta C. Francis the sum of One hundred dollars - Sixthly. My will and desire is that all the residue of my estate, taking out the slaves & negroes above mentioned shall be sold, and if there should be any surplus over & above expenses, debts, legacies or that such surplus shall be equally divided & paid over to my children, in equal proportion share & share alike, to them & each of them, their executors, administrators and assigns absolutely forever - And lastly. I do hereby constitute and appoint Richard Smith my lawful Executor, to all intents and purposes to execute this my last will and testament according to the true intent and meaning of the same, and every part and clause thereof. In witness whereof I the said John Francis, Sr. do hereunto set my hand and seal this 2<sup>nd</sup> day of September 1864

I Nathaniel Moody of the County of Stokes and State of North Carolina being of sound disposing mind and memory, but weak in body and knowing the uncertainty of life and the certainty of death do make and declare this to be my last will and testament first I give my soul unto Almighty God who gave it and my body I desire to be buried in a decent Christian burial under at the discretion of my Executor herein after named 2<sup>nd</sup> that all my funeral expenses be paid by my Executor out of the first monys which may come into his hands - I desire that my Executor shall collect all the fees that are now or may hereafter fall due to my estate as Sheriff of Stokes County - Some of these fees are due from the County of Forsyth, Surry & other Counties in the State and when these fees are collected I desire my Executor to pay off the following persons Claims (to wit) a debt due Drsly George James for grain & bacon a debt due Jackson Room for flour a debt due Raynor Lawson of about Seventy dollars a debt due Wm. T. Lash for flour & bacon after all the above debts are paid off and satisfied if there should be a surplus I desire my Executor to pay the same over to my beloved wife Elizabeth Moody to be held absolutely. And lastly I do hereby constitute and appoint my trusted friend and relation J. M. Peppin to carry out and execute this my last will and testament hereby revoking all other wills by me made in testimony whereof I have hereunto set my hand and affixed my seal.
