I the said man being of sound and perfect mind and memory blessed be God, do this 17th Day of August in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and twenty one make and publish this my last Will and Testament in manner following that is to say

All my Personal Estate at my decease that will not be wanted for the payments of my just Debts shall belong and is hereby bequeathed to my beloved wife Catharina as her sole property for her & her heirs for ever after my decease my son Daniel shall have laid off to him fifty acres of Land from my present dwelling place measured and laid off as I have agreed with him including a spring near his Buildings for himself and his heirs for ever and the remaining part of my said dwelling place shall be divided into equal shares between my two Daughters Elizabeth & Catharina after the decease of my said wife Catharina

After the decease of my said wife Catharina it is my will that all the movable Property &c. which may be left at her decease unto my children George John Jacob Elizabeth Daniel & Catharina shall be divided between them and their heirs And I do hereby constitute & appoint my beloved son George Executor of this my last Will and Testament & do hereby revoke all former wills by me made ratifying and confirming this and no other to be my last will & Testament In Witness whereof I have signed sealed and delivered by the Testator

In the name of God a man awfully impressed with the truth that man is born to die and that the period of his earthly existence is uncertain being weak in body but of sound mind and memory believing in Christ my Redeemer and in the resurrection to eternal life I Daniel Christianman do make and ordain this my last Will Testament while I humbly recommend my soul to God I bequeath my Body to its maker and to be decently interred

Firstly I give and bequeath unto my Mother Hannah Christianman the sum of three hundred Dollars to her use forever

Secondly I give and bequeath unto my Brother Jacob Christianman my deep cut saw and all my other working tools of every description to his use forever

Thirdly I give and bequeath unto my Brother Thomas Christianman my apparel I give forever

Fourthly I give and bequeath unto my sister Phillisene Simons my silver Table Spoon forever

Fifthly I give and bequeath unto my sister Christine Christianman my silver Watch chain & key forever

Sixthly I give and bequeath unto my sister Sabina Christianman my Desk and Book case forever on condition that she pay to my sister Mary Trancan the sum of Ten Dollars and to my sister Dorothy Christianman the sum of Five Dollars which sums I give and bequeath to them forever

Seventhly I give and bequeath unto my Brother in Law J. Christianman the sum of Twelve Dollars on condition that my Executor hereafter appointed will take and apply it in discharge of a debt bond or note made and executed by the said J. Christianman to and whom I am indebted

Eighthly From the rest and residue of my property not herein before bequeathed it is my will and desire that my Executor hereafter named shall pay all just claims against me or my Estate and if any thing be remaining whatever it may be I give and bequeath the same to my Mother Hannah Christianman forever Provided that should said test and residue not be sufficient to discharge every just claim against my Estate it shall be covered from the property of said Mother

Ninthly I herewith constitute and appoint my Brother Jacob
