

I John Martin of the County of Sike & State of North Carolina being of sound & perfect mind & memory blessed be God for the same do this 10th day of May 1825 make & publish this my last will & testament in manner following that is to say of all the worldly goods it has pleased God to bestow me with do give & bequeath as herein mentioned I lend unto Nancy my wife during her natural life four Negroes Ed & Ben frank & Sarah also all the Land adjoining together with all appertaining west of the road & to the creek up the creek to the old still house bound up the same to the south extremity of my land that is to say all adjoining Land both on the Little Yadkin & to her in like manner to two cows & calves and as many hoggs as she shall chuse out of my stock & flock house hold furniture & the shall chuse & choose head of horses such as she shall chuse the negro & slaves also plantation lot #14 & 2 I give to my daughter Polly & Byman & the lawful heirs of her body the negro and two slaves and that the 1500 \$ Hampton Byman owes me by bond & to be given up to him & has he bound the children to the amount of more than the interest of 12% bonds amounts to the balance to be made up to 40. 3 I give to my daughter Elizabeth Harris & the heirs of her body one negro girl named Mary during the natural life of her or Elizabeth & at her death to be her & her heirs of said Mary to be divided equally among the the children of her Elizabeth

I give to my son James the Land he now lies on as laid out between & him & John also two Negroes he has in possession Nam & Peter. I give to my son Joseph Martin the part of the tract I bought on Black creek that he has owned & used for several years that is to say Below south of the creek & the mouth of the branch that runs by Joseph's cabin also the Land adjoining Beny Coomer Ben Beazley & others 1/6 acre land adjoining the land that David Coomer sold to Martin. Both #6 & the 2 Negroes he has in possession Nam & Peter

I give to my son John Martin the balance of the tract of Land that he & James lies on as laid out & now is Below them & about of hundred acres adjoining Slavery Smith #6 2 Negroes Anthony & seal with their condition after that has four children alive the young at one year old my son James to have one of them during the first four years of his life & then to pay him the full value of the one that goes to James by his

I give to my son Samuel the one half in value of the land and of land in Jackson County on line back State of Tennessee Two Negroes the attorney one horse of the value of \$100 three cows & calves bed & furniture

I give to my son George the other half of the tract of Land on Pine creek Jackson & State of Tennessee three Negroes three little Mules & enough cows & horses of the value one hundred dollars & a saddle worth 15 dollars & mule three horses & calves bed & furniture

I give to my son Thomas Martin the lands beginning at the southern Extremity of my Land I now live on up the old still house bound down the same to the creek down the creek to mouth of old spring branch up the same to the head of the chinkapin patch then Northwardly as the road runs to the Quaker meeting house all that adjoining East & North of said road creek & branch & all as one other parcels is located on the big creek a living Timothy Rock Jacob Parrychata Vaugh & others also the other parcel or tract lying near Springfield Meeting house known by the Name of Hardin's Woods & end the following Negroes Negroes Webster & at his mother's death or deportation of Middlewood City & give only her excepted & from one horse of the value of one hundred dollars saddle of the value fifteen dollars one Bed & furniture three horses & calves —

I give to my son William Gilham Martin all the balance of the Lands I now live on that I have left to his Mother during Natural life & lying west & south of the Land given to Thomas that the town Louis' boat on the water of the double creek & Little Yadkin & a mule giving above stated amount of Two Hundred acres & such Negroes as herein mentioned that is to say Harden & all his his clothes & household articles of Middlewood house Frank & Sarah & her I give one horse of the value of one hundred dollars saddle of the value of fifteen dollars one horse & calves Bed & furniture &c

& Now for this be taken as my special desire & will that my three grand children John & Martin & Maryann Blance & Sonomity Blance be raised & taken care of at the discretion & care of my son James Martin & that the two girls be educated as to read & write & Martin as long as possible in this will I also will that John Martin shall have at the age of Twenty one years which I now write & bequeath to him a small Negro boy by the name of Sanders also one horse & saddle worth twenty five dollars and be educated so as to understand & know the English letter & Greek languages & after this far learnt to be given to the study of the Law of capacity with others of it I also will to my grand daughter Maryann, this one step to be taken of her & like wise to my grand daughter Sonomity Blance
