To all Christian people whom it may concern that I John Peter Fidler of Stokes County and State of North Carolina calling to mind the mortality of my body knowing that it is appointed for all men once to die and being blessed with some worldly property withal I desire may be disposed of in the following manner first of all I desire that my funeral expenses together with my just debts be discharged by my Executor hereafter named. I give and bequeath to my beloved wife Elizabeth my dwelling house and garden and as much of the home hold and kitchen furniture as she should see proper to keep with three further beds & furniture, after the death of my wife I give one bed & furniture to daughter Mary Cothurne & one to my daughter Matilda Brewer my desk & my big Bible I give to my wife her life time then the desk & Bible to my son William Fidler I also give to my wife one cow & calf & fifty dollars in money & further I give to my wife three two tracts of land lying between Thomasburg & Jm Fidler here now for my executor to have the hunting of them for her maintaining I also give her four hhd of hogs chops & one further hhd for my wife to give to whom she see cause I also give to my son John Fidler ten dollars I also give daughter Phoebe Frazier ten dollars I also give my daughter Matilda Brewer that tract of land joining that of

119 I also give to my daughter Mrs. Oliver, horse & harness & my round leaf walnut after her Mother's death. I give to my daughter Mary Chipman that other tract of land joining that I give to Matilda after her Mother's death. Likewise I give & bequeath to my son William Morton all and singular my place, taking whereon I now dwell to him & his heirs for ever with the forty five acre joining & the home tract I also give my road wagon & harness to him. And further it is my will that the residue of my property that is not here before bequeathed to be equally divided between my wife Elizabeth and Mary Chipman, William Morton & Matilda Oliver also what my property my wife & the heirs & should remain at her death to be equally divided between my son Matthew Morton, William Morton, Mary Chipman, Rhoda Brown & Matilda Oliver. And lastly I do ordain constitute & appoint my beloved son William Morton Executor to this my last Will and Testament in manner & form aforesaid hereby ratifying & confirming this to be my last Will in the presence of Legally Sealed and acknowledged the nineteenth day of June the one thousand eight hundred & twenty eight.

In the name of God Amen! I Matthew Rich of Wake County and State of North Carolina being weak in body but of perfect mind & memory do this 22nd day of April 1829 make & ordain this to be my last Will and Testament hereby revoking all other by me made of a prior date & declare this & no other to be my last Will and Testament in manner & form following

- 1/ I will that my body be decently interred according to the custom & form usual in the United Brethren Church -
- 2/ I will that after my burial expenses & all my just debts are paid that my beloved wife shall receive one hundred dollars to be paid to her as soon as my executor can realize it out of my effects should as cash or not a sufficient sum be found on hand is the case of a deficiency of cash on hand she shall be paid immediately after my executor has qualified she shall have one year provision laid off out of the grain or hand or growing or other necessary on hand & if some article of provisions is necessary for her subsistence should not be on hand my executor shall purchase them. It is my express wish & desire that my executor shall select one person & my wife one person who together with my executor shall lay off said yearly provision taking into consideration that if my children who may be left with her care to live with her out of the years provision the two men so chosen should by no means be related to either mine or her family but being disinterested persons, in addition to the above I will that my wife shall have such station & house hold furniture as these two men with my executor shall deem necessary. Further more she may choose one or two of the cows which may be mine or my dearest provided she can or will keep them or has care for them - 3/ I will that my executor shall procure beds for those of my children who have not yet been married at my decease & have not heretofore received beds - 4th As my son Solomon has received a horse from me I will that in consideration thereof my other four sons receive each of them thirty dollars in cash which thirty dollars shall be placed on interest as soon as
