The Noncupative Will of John Pickings decd.

The request of John Pickings decd respecting his property made
to me on the second day of October one thousand eight hundred and
twenty eight, was that Nancy his wife should keep the house and land
(except the portion herein after mentioned to be allotted to Matilda his eldest
daughter as soon as she becomes married) so long as she remains my
widow with this consideration that each of the remaining children are
to have their portions as soon as they respectively are to the age of
seventeen & twenty one, one because & the grey mare called Dylan
Matilda my eldest daughter is to have one hundred acres of land
laid off from the lower or south part of my plantation and if this
one hundred acres should not include a certain spring that
will be situated near it she is to have the rest of sufficient
land from the remainder to make a good road to get to it.
& enough at the spring to build a house on & room for its conveni-
ency she is to have one bed & bedding one because we have by
table & a black walnut corn cupboard my male slave to be
sold to help pay my debts together with the property out of doors
& one piece of land and all that can be spent in the slaves
if required My female slave to be returned to Davis
Durrell of whom I purchased her. Done by the request of
John Pickings on the day and date above mentioned
