I give to my son Perrin Joyce one negro boy named Lewis. I give to my son Hamilton Joyce one negro boy named John. I give to my daughter Naomi one negro girl child named Amanda to them their heirs & assigns forever. My desire is that Hamilton & Calvin shall have each a feather bed & furniture, & as to respect my daughter Fanny England what is now demand her proportionable part is to be divided equally between the heirs of her body two sons when they arrive to twenty one years of age & living & if dead the sd part to be equally divided between all her brothers & sisters. My will is that my land & negroes & personal estate remains after the decease of myself & wife shall be sold at public auction & that the net amt. be equally distributed between the before named legatees. And the witness named W. B. Joyce as by these presents constitutes ordain & appoint Lemuel Joyce & Hamilton Joyce Executrix of this my last will & testament.
