

The following is the nuncupative will of John West deceased late of Stokes County in the State of North Carolina during his last sickness in his own house in which he had resided for many years, not before his death in the presence of the witnesses whose names are hereunto subscribed after having sent for two of them (twins) John Clayton & John Lawrence and directing his conversation to them, he made the following request in about the following language (to will). It is my will I desire that all my property both real & personal remain with my wife Elizabeth West during her natural life in order that she may thereby be enabled to raise my younger children & that after her death the whole be equally divided among my children share & share alike - that my sons George & William continue to occupy the plantations on which they now live & work as they have done where I have shown them and that my wife Elizabeth may give to any of my children during her life time such things as she can spare conveniently.

The said John West departed this life on the 29th day of March 1833 & that at the time of making the above request he was of sound mind & disposing memory. In witness of all which we have hereunto set our hands this 1st day of April 1833

All property whatever which at the time of my decease I may happen to bequeath by these presents to my beloved wife Elizabeth Kramisch to be divided in equal share after her death between my two daughters Louisa Charlotte & Christiane Susanna & I do also appoint my beloved wife the sole Executrix of this my last will and testament. Salem this 31st day of January 1824.

The last will & testament of Maria Rosina Fockett of Salem Stokes County State of North Carolina — I give & bequeath unto my sister Paulina Fockett ten dollars in money, my desk, my paragon drap, half a dozen towels — 2/ I give & bequeath unto my sister Lydia Fockett one silver tea spoon, half a dozen towels, one red calico drap, 1 German Book & one unquilted bed quilt — 3/ I give & bequeath unto my cousin Emily Stocke my bed, one piece white & one piece coloured homspun, provided she continues to live with my parents, but in case she does not continue to live with them she is not to receive any part of the above mentioned Legacy. 4/ I give & bequeath to my sister Elizabeth Fockett my work stand chair my clock & one german book — 5/ I give & bequeath to my mother Ann Berethia Fockett my umbrella, my wooden shawl, all my caps & the residue of my wearing apparel — 6/ I give & bequeath unto my brother Henry Fockett my chest, one piece of linnen, one silver tea spoon, my german Bible — 7/ I give & bequeath unto my brother Augustus Fockett my English Bible, one silver tea spoon — 8/ I give & bequeath unto my brother Christopher Fockett the balance of cash what may remain in my safebox at my decease) including Ten dollars, bequeathed to my sister Paulina — 9/ The rest of what may remain of my property after my decease not herein bequeathed shall be divided between my Parents & Brothers & Sisters

And I hereby constitute & appoint my friend Charles T. Bagger of Salem as Executor of this my last will & testament — In witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand & seal the 20th day of February 1833
