 names and ages are as follows Viz^t 1st a
 woman named Dicy aged thirty two years
 2^d a boy named Anthony aged thirteen years
 3^d a girl named Sarah aged nine years
 4th a girl named Delpha aged six years
 5th a boy named Jeffery aged three years

to have and to hold unto the said Jefe Sister
 his heirs and assigns forever and I do hereby
 warrant & defend said Negroes with
 all their Increase unto the said Jefe
 Sister against the lawful claims of all
 persons whatsoever In Testimony whereof I
 have hereunto set my hand and seal and
 at the same time have delivered said Negroes
 unto the said Jefe Sister this fifth Day of
 November in the year of our Lord One
 thousand seven hundred & twenty one
