The thirteenth of the twelfth month one thousand  
eight Hundred & fifteen I Henry Mills of Stokes County

shillings I give to my daughter Charity one feather bed  
and furniture one spinning wheel. And further it is my  
will and desire the residue of my personal Estate not hinted  
upon will be sold & equally divided between my daughter  
& namely Sarah Ann Mehlah Elizabeth Mary Semina &  
Charity And it is also my will that my deceased daughter  
Margaret Children draw an equal share of the residue  
of my above as if she was living

And lastly I do ordain constitute and appoint my loving  
wife Charity my truly friend Mehlah Ellison my son  
Joseph Joint executors of this my will and Testament hereby  
ratifying and confirming this and no other to be my last
