In the name of God Amen I Joseph Platt of Stokes County North Carolina being my sick in body but of good perfect mind memory & understanding that knowing the appointed hour when to die do hereunto make and ordain this my last will and Testament that is to say First I give and recommend my soul into the hands of Almighty God that gave it and my body to the earth to be buried at the discretion of my executors not doubting but to have a happy resurrection and as touching my worldly estate I give bequeath & dispose of in manner & form following.

First. It is my will that my just debts and funeral charges be duly paid out of my estate by my executors hereafter mentioned as also all my outstanding debts due to me to be collected by them. And then I give and bequeath unto my son Peter my Bay Mare Colt about two years old to be delivered unto him by my executors immediately after my decease. As also my plantation where I formerly lived on adjoining the Wachovia tract at the rate of Three Hundred dollars but nevertheless my above son Peter shall pay unto my Daughter Susannah Elizabeth one Hundred dollars and also to my Daughter Sarah one Hundred dollars immediately after my son Peter becomes to be the full age of Twenty one years or takes possession of my said Plantation.

I Will unto my Daughter Fatharina a wife of Jesse Styrus one Hundred dollars out of my Estate to be paid to her by my executors immediately after my son Peter arrives to the age of Twenty one years.

Item It is my will that after all my just

Debts are paid as well as my outstanding debts collected that the residue of my Estate shall be equally divided amongst all my children viz. Peter, Mary, Catharina Susannah Elizabeth Sarah.

And lastly I herewith nominate constitute & appoint my friends Joseph Holden & John Doubt esquires & no other to be my executors to this my last will & testament I hereby revoke all former bequests promises legacies by me made & herewith ratify & confirm this to be my last Will and Testament.
