I, Joseph P. Lindsay of Stokes County North Carolina, being of
Sound Mind and Memory but considering the uncertainty of my earthly
existence, do make and declare this my last will and Testament in
Manner and form following (to wit) First that my executors (here-
after named) shall provide for my body a decent burial suitable to the
wishes of my friends and relations, and pay all funeral expenses together
with all just debt, however and to whomsoever owing out of the moneys that
may first come into their hands as a part or parcel of my estate -
Then, I give and devise to William Alexander Wallace Reid when he
becomes Twenty one years old, One Negro boy named John, and One horse
(worth One hundred & fifty dollars) and bridle & saddle; One hundred dollars
in money; and One bed and furniture. Provided that the said William A. W. Reid
shall remain with my wife Eliza Ann Lindsay until he arrives at the age of
Twenty one years, and continues dutiful & obedient to her otherwise he is
to have nothing - I also give and devise to him the said William A. W. Reid
at my wife's death or marriage, Three hundred and fifteen acres of
Land (all the lands that I now possess) comprising three tracts, including
the one whereon I now live, with all appurtenances thereunto belonging -
My wife to have possession till her death or marriage.

Item. At my wife's death or marriage, I will and devise to Samuel B. Ziglar
One Negro boy named Green, Provided that the said Samuel B. Ziglar shall
attend to my wife's business until William A. W. Reid arrives at the age of
Twenty one years; & otherwise the said Samuel B. Ziglar is to have nothing.
I also devise and direct that my wife shall keep the said Negro Green as long
as she may please to do so - Item. At my wife's death or marriage I will
and devise to Sarah E. Ziglar One Negro girl named Frances and her mother
from now. Provided that the said Sarah E. Ziglar shall marry to suit my
wife. Otherwise she is to have nothing. I also devise and direct that my wife
shall keep the said Negro girl and mother as long as she may please to do so.
Item. I give and devise to my beloved wife Eliza Ann Lindsay all the remainder of
my estate both real and personal to have full and complete possession of, with
all right to sell or dispose of in any way she may see proper -
And lastly, It is my will and desire that my wife Eliza Ann Lindsay and Samuel
B. Ziglar be my Executors, without being required by Court to give bond or surety,
to execute this my last will & Testament according to the true intent and meaning of
the same, and every part thereof - hereby revoking and declaring void all other
