And I will that she shall have yearly provision allow her ~~as~~ as is usual for widows to have.

I further will that all my remaining property be sold and all the price and then the money to be divided among to my Daughter Natharine the wife of Hamilton Wilson fifty dollars if it should hold out. And to my Daughter Elizabeth the wife of Charles Homer fifty dollars. And to Philip Crest my son in law one dollar & fifty cents. And to my Daughter Peter the wife of Philip Crest fifty dollars. And should there be any over plus the above mentioned Daughters to go in equal proportion.

And after the death of my beloved wife or should she marry, then the property yet remaining to be sold & the money equally divided amongst my Daughters as above mentioned. I appoint Frederick C.
