I Joseph Coflin late from Granville County in the State of Virginia, but now removed from there to this State of North Carolina in Wata County to show unto all my beloved daughter Martha Martin wife of James Martin that I do make and ordain and declare this instrument my last will and testament this 9th day of March 1823 Respecting all things hereinafter. I desire that all my last will be as follows: I wish on my grave or any by my beloved friend James Martin and my beloved daughter Martha Martin whom I appoint my Executor & bequeath to carry this my last will into effect. Then, I have and bequeath unto my beloved son Edmund Coflin my money more than I own and have in my Chest & have allowed him to him at this place & having drawn him up in a little four wheeled carriage with me in it him to the place.

Then, I have and bequeath to son Edmund Coflin my horse and my pump that I left at my old home in Granville County & my folding table & my Brown Wagon Chair and a wooden bottom that I left and have him to use & have him to use away all my riding chair which I had given him to use of before I left Granville also I have unto my beloved son Edmund Coflin my old beloved daughter Martha wife of James Martin that all my last will that I left at the house of bequeathing of four fowls Granville pine and black & white that I have known by the widow Polly Spence and the widow Smith and Mr. Whistling also four new Hatched ad. birds to be 3rd ally divided between my beloved son Edmund and my beloved daughter Martha Martin.

Then, I have to my son Edmund appearance in large quantity I left at the house of my mother Granville Wagon having away & my Refused to have them up saying I have been all of them to them which I did not want more. Then, I have and bequeath to my son Edmund

son Edmund Coflin by him in my mother's body among which were some gold of silver or other to work in a gold. With a cart that belongs to me and about with them also twenty five and five or six head of cattle that was taken from me by the or by my mother's body four heads.

Then, I have and bequeath to my beloved son Edmund Coflin that my old beloved daughter Martha be all the debt when they become due of good state with that I left in Granville Granville Virginia in the hands of Thomas Spence to be collected when due to the amount of three hundred and twenty five dollars for his Receipt and also all the money the may arise for the rest of my old plantation which I wish to be Thomas Spence for fifty dollars yearly & every year as long as I may live also my last and furniture & wearing clothes.

Then, I have to my son Edmund all my children & bequeath that was taken from me by the said William Coflin by him back of gold pieces of silver & silver.

Then I am writing myself I the said Martha Coflin have set my hand and seal this 9th day of March 1823
