ever to the only proper use and benefit
of him. the said Thomas Temple Armstrong his
heirs and assigns forever In Testimony whereof
I have hereunto set my hand & seal this 1st

of October one thousand seven hundred and
thirteen, I Edmund Bowman of the County of States
North Carolina being somewhat sick but of
sound mind and memory thank be to God for
it but calling to mind the mortality of my life
and knowing that it is approaching well as
one to die do make and ordain this my last
will and Testament.

I give and bequeath unto my four living chil-

William Richard George & Archibald Bowman my said
eldest sons and Tenantants lying on the south
branch of Black Creek with all my Chattels houses
and all my property intended to be equally divided
among them my four sons to be possessed by them
and their heirs forever But I will that George
& Archibald my two younger sons is not have their
share of the Estate till they come of age but is
to be kept in the hands of my executors till they are
of age then to be delivered to them in full without
fraud or delay for them and their heirs to possess
forever

I will that if any one of my sons do improve any part
of my land the improvement shall be his or work to be his
own and not to be called any part of my Estate but
he is to have and hold it him and his heirs forever
and his lot of the Road shall be where he has
improved

I give to my living wife Margaret Bowman my said
wife Archibald permanent

My executors may put my son George and Archibald to
learn a trade if it shall be judged good

I give to my living wife Margaret her bed and all that
furniture that has good beds one fourth of household
furniture to be enjoyed and possessed by her and her
heirs forever

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
