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whill many after my decess the is to have the thirds of my Estate and secondly my beloved son Michael Deange is to have the thirds out of my estate after my wife Deceased & thirdly my beloved Daughter Elizabeth is to have the use of my estate to whom I likewise constitute -

I name & be will Michael Spoonhour and Henry Spoonhour to be my executor over my estate & no other this is to bequeath and confirming in witness whereunto I have set my hand and seal in the year of ~~1799~~ 1799 one thousand seven hundred and ninety July the second came here before it is signed.

I pronounce and declare Michael Deange this to be my last will and testament Signed sealed published in the presence of us
