for Sixty Dollars, if he cannot get that he is to

I do appoint my friend John Butner as my
executor to this my last will and testament and
do hereby revoke all others and do declare this to
be my last will and testament.

Senr. of Stokes Young & Stokes of North Carolina being sick and
weak in body but of sound mind & memory do make and impell
declare this to be my last Will and Testament that is to say

Fist. I give and bequeath unto Barbara wife of John Lard
Mary wife of John Lard, Sally wife of Jacob Palky, Lucy
wife of Anthony Sinkle Elizabeth wife of Adam Butner &
Henry Hine in equal portions a certain summe or obligation
which I have on John Hine for one hundred dollars due at
cuncry times by instalments of fifty dollars each. It is
my will that the said summe given to Elizabeth wife of
Adam Butner shall be equally divided amongst all
the children which she now has & may hereafter have
& the said summe given to Henry wife of John Lard to be equally
divided amongst all the children which she now has &
may hereafter have.

Second. It is my will that my negro slaves shall be
valued by trusted men chosen for that purpose and
remain in possession of my wife during her natural
life if she should choose to keep them a sum of
them as she chooses and at her death in any of
my children should choose to take said negroes at
the valuation they may do so & pay to the other children
a proportionable part of said valuation otherwise to be sold.

Third. I give and bequeath unto my wife during
her natural life one horse creature four Chay
all the Sheep, three Peacocks, one set of Birds and
such of the Household furniture as she may choose
to keep for her use.

Fourth. It is my will that all my other estate
not otherwise disposed of shall be sold by my
executors and the money arising therefrom together

with the money arising from
in case they shall be sold, to be equally divided
amongst all my children then and then alive
to them and their heirs: It is to be understood that
all that part of my estate hereby willed to my
daughter Elizabeth wife of Adam Butner is to
be equally divided amongst all the children which
she may have and not to go to her husband

I do nominate & appoint John Frith and
William Fox executors of this my last Will &
Testament

of Hoke County and State of North Carolina being of
sound and disposing mind and memory do this Twenty
first day of January in the year of our Lord one thousand
Eight Hundred & fifteen make and ordain this to
be my last will and Testament in manner and form
following that is to say.

First I will that all my just debts and funeral
charges be paid by my executors by a sum to be raised
and levied out of my cash outstanding debts and
movable property for that purpose

2d. I will that my beloved wife Elizabeth possess
and enjoy my dwelling house Kitchen & Barn and
all other buildings belonging to me on the East side of
Sandy Creek which runs through my plantation and
also all that part of my plantation which lies on
the said East side of Sandy Creek and ditch during
her natural life. I also give and bequeath unto
my beloved wife during her natural life the following
negroes Neg^r Bob, Harry, and Agnes and all her
children and all their increase and after my wife's
death I will that the said negroes be reallocated among
my heirs and that the money arising therefrom be
equally divided into seven shares that is to say equal
shares & that my three sons Thos^r Isaac, Romeo, and
Hezekiah and son-in-law Maloy Smith and Robert
Winston shall each have one share of said money
& that the children of my daughter Sally wife of
Robert Smith and the children of my daughter
Macey wife of Jacky Golding shall have the two
remaining shares that is to say the children of
each of said daughters one share and that
