In the name of God Amen I Michael Weaver of Stokes County and State of North Carolina being sick but of perfect mind & memory thanks be given to God calling into mind the mortality of my body do make and ordain this my last will & testament in the following manner & form I give & bequeath all my estate to Daniel Weaver & I do likewise constitute and appoint Daniel Weaver & Leonard Weaver Executors of this my last will & testament & I do hereby utterly disavow and revoke all former wills & testament bequests and executors ratifying and confirming this & no other to be my last will & testament In witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal this fourteenth day of February one thousand

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I give & bequeath unto Thomas Smith son of Robert Smith junior Grand son of Robert Smith Sen^r the Goods hereafter Mentioned to wit one negro woman named Lucy Dots to one negro named Judah Dots to one younger negro boy named Henry Dots one negro boy named Tom one Dots named Friday with my black Hogs & sheep and fatten my household furniture and all my Plantation tools and other working tools of the said Thomas Smith my Grandson shall take care and maintain & support myself and my wife Mary Smith during each of our lifetimes and at our Death see that we be decently buried in consideration of the above Bequest & I do hereby make and ordain my beloved wife Mary and my beloved Grand son Thomas Smith Executors of this my last will & testament and do revoke & disavow & make void all other wills heretofore by me made Confirming and ratifying and no other to be my last will & testament In witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and affixed my seal this the 1 day of June in the year of our Lord one thousand Eight hundred & two Signed sealed published & declared by the said Robert Smith the testator as his last will & testament in the presence of us who were present at the time of signing Reading the same

The Verbal Will of Samuel Hampton late of
Stokes County & State of North Carolina Dec. taken
down in writing within nine days after his
Death witnessed

That his widow & infant Bethecia Hampton
should keep the plantation the negroes & the whole of
his property in her possession that his children

should be raised & educated, that his children as they
grow up & stand in need should have one of the young
negroes a piece, that his widow & children when
a Division takes place should all have an equal
share, that two horses now remaining on the
plantation on known by the name of Peubram
& one he purchased of William Reynolds be sold
immediately at public sale that eight or ten head
of cattle should be sold if in need, that John Boston
negro (and William Blackburn join with his widow
Bethecia in the administration) see that this his
last will & testament be duly executed taken down
in the presence of the subscribing witnesses who
heard him pronounce the above he then being in
his perfect senses.
