

In the name of God Amen. — I Jacob Krueger of the County of Stokes State of North Carolina being aged though in good health and of sound mind and memory do make and renew this my last will & testament in manner & form following that is I give & bequeath unto my beloved wife Savannah Krueger the land and all the property I shall die possessed of together with its use during her natural life and at her death I give unto my son John Krueger's widow Mary Elizabeth Krueger two hundred acres of land lying in Muddy Creek & Barkers Creek as long as she is said John Krueger's widow after her marriage or death this land shall belong to the heirs of her body that is Solomon Krueger, Thomas Krueger & Susanna Krueger for which they is to be charged two hundred & fifty dollars in the final settlement of my estate wherein all my children shall share equally that is to say my son Frederick Krueger & John Krueger is dead he has three children them three is to have one share equally divided to them my daughter Elizabeth Shultz my daughter Catherine Conrad & my daughter Savannah Hitchcock to each of which my son John Krueger's widow shall pay fifty dollars after the death of my wife Savannah & divide the balance of my estate equally. — And lastly I hereby revoke all other or former wills & statements published & declare this & this alone to be my last will & testament I nominate, constitute & appoint my beloved son Henry Shultz & Jacob Shultz & the executors of this my last will & testament given under my hand this first day of May in the year of our Lord my thousand eight hundred & twenty four Lest his mark be acknowledged, sealed, published & acknowledged in the presence of us who are present at the signing sealing, this 1st day of the month of May in the year of our Lord thousand eight hundred & twenty four

In the name of God Amen. — I Nancy Hitchcock of Stokes County and State of Carolina being weak & failing in body but of sound mind and memory do make this my last will & testament in manner & form following (Signed) I first will that all my just debts and funeral charges be paid out of my movable property estate and I give & bequeath my bed bed end two good sheets one counterpane one coverlid and curtain & bed quilt to a daughter of my daughter Nancy if she has one by the name of Nancy if not then I will that the above property be given to my son Thomas daughter Susan — I give and bequeath my walnut box chest upper counterpane flax wheel and saddle to my son Thomas daughter Susannah — By I give and bequeath my popular chest two plates three butter plates a pattern dish & a white counterpane with and racing apparel to be equally divided between my two daughters Nancy & Elizabeth Shultz & her alihe — By I give & bequeath all my remaining property either in accounts notes or property that has not hitherto been bequeathed to my son Thomas to him and his heirs forever I hereby nominate and appoint my beloved son Thomas Hitchcock executor to carry this my last will and testament into effect and I hereby disannul and make void all and every other former will by myself made and established this to be my last will and testament in manner and form above written

In testimony whereof I have hereunto set my hand and affixed my seal this 1st day of November 1824 in the presence of Nancy & Hitchcock & Jacob Shultz
